



Love our Laneways is an initiative established by Dun-Laoghaire Rathdown County Council ('DLRCC') in partnership with A Playful City. The project is seeking to become an exemplar of how laneways can be reimaged by working with the local community. Pearse Drive/ 'The Gaps' in the Pearse estate has been identified by DLRCC as the first location for the Love Our Laneways pilot project.

What's going on?



A Playful City is working with DLRCC & your local community to develop a vision for The Gaps to reimagine it as a more playful, people-centered place for the community. The process developed throughout the pilot will become a tool for decision making, and a way to showcase how community led changes to the public realm can positively affect community life.

A Phased Project

Each phase involves listening to and collaborating with community members and local partners. During Phases 1 & 2 the focus has been to listen and learn from the community, to build relationships with our project partners and local stakeholders, and to explore how we can best reimagine The Gaps in Sallynoggin together.

2021 Phase 1 & 2

September

Love our Laneways introduced to local councilors in DLR, various departments in DLRCC & the Sallynoggin Estate Management Group.

October

Community surveys distributed & collected using installed postbox. Door-door conversations with residents begin

Online & in-person workshops with local stakeholders to introduce the project to the wider community

Partnerships started with IADT & SCFE

November

Walks on the lane with different age groups to discuss how different members of the community could use the lane in the future

Initial findings reviewed & studied to inform the preparation for community pop-up

December

Community popUP to present the research so far back to the community. Chance to discuss what needs further attention, where our efforts should be focused & what the next steps could be.

March

Present the next steps to community to find out how and where everyone can participate and get involved to reimagine the lane

April onwards

NEXT STEPS: Start to reimagine Pearse Drive together. As we enter Phase 3 we are partnering with local community groups, running workshops to trial solutions in the lane over the next 6 months.

Learning from you...

We have engaged with various members of the community, local stakeholders, DLR Councilors, departments within DLRCC and partnering institutions. To prioritise co-design, our events have focused on learning from everyone rather than presenting a solution.

We have used the events and partnerships so far to gather and build a detailed understanding of the area that sought to capture as many voices as possible.

As we enter Phase 3 we will start to trial solutions for the lane with community partners, based on the feedback we received during Phases 1 & 2.

What we've heard so far...

So far we have heard from over 500 people of all ages from Sallynoggin who use 'The Gaps' and there has been overwhelming support for reimagining 'The Gaps' in Pearse estate.

at first we wanted to find out how you felt about the space as it was...

- Feedback so far showed that the majority of local residents view parts of the lane somewhat negatively. This project has started, and hopes to continue to change this view
- Nearly 50% of respondents would like to feel safer on the lane, and would not actively use the lane at night
 - We asked what three words would you use to describe Pearse Drive Lane?
- The Gaps are a crucial travel route for the community used for many things like traveling to school, walking the dog or a shortcut to get from A-B. A 'local lane'

Through our conversations with you, we have learnt that you would like The Gaps to be brighter and to feel like a safer space at night, a space that is clean and is celebrated as an asset for all of the community to enjoy as they travel through them.



We've learnt that people want to admire, appreciate, feel proud, enjoy and feel safer in the lane, that nearly


98%

of people we've heard use The Gaps at least once a week

- The wider community would like the lane to be more inviting for all ages, while many local residents highlighted how some sections of the lane are poorly lit.
- Many identified the lane as a centre point in Sallynoggin, they would like to see The Gaps used as a pop up/meanwhile space for markets, performance, classes & gardens.

- Safety & Accessibility


