## The **dlr Festival of Inclusion** is a fantastic initiative taking place in the area this Autumn.

Celebrating our heritage and unique history, the series of events begins on 6 October.

As part of our ongoing commitment to foster inclusive communities the **dlr Festival of Inclusion** will take place from the 6 - 14 October 2017. The theme of this year's festival is "**Connecting Communities**".

The **dlr Festival of Inclusion** is a celebration of our diverse communities and the people in them. Each year we recognise, celebrate and enjoy the work done by the many volunteer and professional groups who every day create positive outcomes, all the while enhancing the lives of families, friends and neighbours. This all helps make our county the most attractive place to live, work and visit.

This flagship event continues to develop and encourage groups to celebrate and showcase the work and activities they do in their communities.

**dlr Festival of Inclusion** aims to provide everyone with opportunities to engage, participate, question and experience things which are unfamiliar to them.

The week-long festival features 5 core events all across the county, so it will give everyone in our county the chance to take part in a truly diverse range of activities.

The Festival launches at 3pm on Friday, 6 October with the **Diversity Fashion Show** in Nutgrove Shopping Centre, Rathfarnham. Saturday features the ever popular Community 5k run in Kilbogget Park with the **Big Sing** in Dún Laoghaire Shopping Centre on Sunday, 8 October. The **Connecting Communities Exhibition** kicks off in the concourse of County Hall on Monday, 9 October and runs all week. The **Mountains to the Sea** Downhill Challenge; a spectacular hike from Ticknock or Barnaslingan Woods to Shankill, brings proceedings to a close on Saturday, 14 October.

Cuirfear tús leis an tsraith imeachtaí an 6 Deireadh Fómhair agus é mar aidhm acu ceiliúradh a dhéanamh ar an oidhreacht agus ar an stair ar leith atá againn.

# Accessibility

## **Matters**

dlr has a diverse population of over 218,000 people living in its area- all with different levels of ability, whether young or old. It's up to us all as community members, working alongside the County Council, to make sure that we keep our walkways as accessible as possible. There are a number of simple ways in which we can make our streets easier to navigate for those with physical disabilities, wheelchair users, those with sight impairments and people pushing buggies.

## Wheelie Bins

Be mindful of others when putting out your bins for collection. Bins are often left out on footpaths without leaving enough room for people to pass safely. Make sure that you play your part by ensuring that your bins are not causing an obstruction for others.



## Glan suas é!

Dog poo can cause all sorts of problems, not least for people with physical disabilities, and can cause a particular annoyance for wheelchair users and people with buggies when it gets on the wheels!

It can also be a major problem for people with visual impairments who can't spot it on the ground and also poses serious health implications for children within our county as it carries bacteria which can be very harmful to young children. You might not know it but there is an on-the-spot fine of €150 for not cleaning up after your dog!

## **Hedging** near **Public Pavements**

Make sure your garden hedges and trees are properly maintained and don't impede access for the general public. Overgrown hedges can present a serious issue for people with disabilities, especially those with sight impairments.

dlr has the power to serve a written notice on the owner or occupier of the land on which such tree, shrub, hedge or other vegetation is situated and has enforcement powers to direct a householder to cut/prune overgrown hedges and shrubs.



## Inconsiderate Parking



This one is pretty self-evident but it is a major issue across many areas of our county. Please be mindful of where you park your car - it can have a very negative impact on the safety and accessibility of our local communities. Pathways, cycle lanes, pedestrian crossings, school bus areas are all there to provide for safer, more sustainable communities and inconsiderate parking prevents them from operating safely.

## dlr Music Generation



In a major boost for young people and music in the local area, dlr has been awarded a place on the prestigious Music Generation - Ireland's National Music Education Programme. Initiated by Music Network, co-funded by supergroup U2, The Ireland Funds, the Department of Education and Skills and dlr Music Education Partnership, this programme will see the establishment of a new music education service for children and young people ages 0 to 18 across the county with a very significant investment of €.4 million over a three year period.

Locally, dlr Music Generation is managed by dlr Music Education Partnership and funded by the Council, Dublin and Dún Laoghaire Education and Training Board, TUSLA, Southside Partnership DLR, Royal Irish Academy of Music, Blackrock Education Centre, IADT, UCD and

Responding to this great news for music education in in our county, Philomena Poole, Chief Executive of **dlr** County Council, said: 'We are delighted to have been awarded this opportunity which will allow us to further develop performance music education in dlr. We look forward to creating new opportunities for the children and young people of the County to develop their musical creativity.'

The project, expected to commence in 2018, will develop a range of affordable and accessible performance music programmes for children and young people in their local area. This will include the coordination of music tuition services within the county, working in partnership with schools, community music groups and tuition across a range of musical genres and styles.




