2018 Council Budget

Philomena Poole, the Chief Executive of dlr County Council, brought the draft budget to Council in November. On adoption of the 2018 budget by the Elected Members, she commented on the increase of over €5 million in expenditure from 2017.



I am happy to announce that 2018 will see €177 million being invested in the county by the Council. We will see a range of economic supports delivered through the Local Enterprise Office which includes Business Support Grants and Mentoring, the launch of the Council's Tourism Strategy and the promotion of the whole Dublin region. There will be no increase in parking charges, and for the Christmas period there will be a special parking promotion which gives you one extra hour free on-street parking.

In our promotion of quality of life, we will see the opening of the new regional park at Fernhill commence, there will be €240,000 spent in supporting community organisations through the grants programme, the Music Generation Programme has been secured for dlr and the Library Programme continues to be an outstanding resource to all of the people of the county. dlr also continues its high performance standard in the delivery of social housing.

dlr's built environment will continue to receive investment in 2018. The LED programme of street lights, the tree management programme, the implementation of the Council's major capital programme, the delivery of the new town of Cherrywood and increasing the footpath repair programme is just a sample of the initiatives.



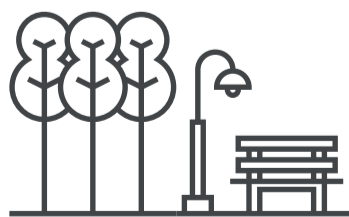

Christmas parking promotion in **dlr**



dlr has a Christmas parking promotion for on-street pay and display parking areas across the county.

The promotion, which runs until 6 January 2018, will gift shoppers and visitors an extra hour free when they pay for a minimum of one hour parking.

How does it work?

It applies to on-street pay and display parking countywide and here is how it works:

Motorists who pay for a minimum of 60 minutes parking will be given 60 minutes free parking time in addition to the 15 minute grace period already available throughout the county.

For example: a person who parks their car at 1pm and pays for 60 minutes parking will not have to return to their car until 3.15pm. This person has paid for 60 minutes covering them from 1pm to 2pm, they will get 60 minutes free, covering them from 2pm to 3pm and will also receive the normal 15 minutes grace period covering them from 3pm to 3.15pm.

Customers do, however, need to be aware that the 3 hour maximum time limit designed to encourage turnover in parking spaces does still apply in the areas covered by the promotion.

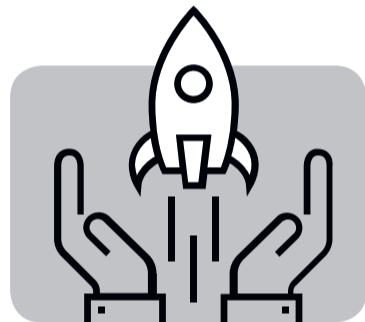

How **dlr** can support your business



Got a business, or thinking of starting a business, in **dlr**?

At the budget meeting in November, Councillors agreed to extend the existing Business Supports Scheme. This means that the number of rate payers in the county to benefit from the scheme will now be 85% of businesses, compared to 72% in 2017. The extended scheme applies to rate payers with a rates bill of €20,000 or less in 2018, compared to a previous ceiling of €10,000 in 2017.

This is part of **dlr's** ongoing commitment to support businesses and enterprise in our county.

Also, did you know that the Council, through its Local Enterprise Office (LEO **dlr**), can provide a one-stop-shop for advice and business support grants, no matter what stage your business is at. The wide variety of grants and other supports on offer help to foster and develop economic activity in our local area.

These supports include:

- Feasibility Grants
- Business Priming Grants
- Business Expansion Grants
- Export Marketing Assistance
- Trading Online Voucher
- Management Development and Business Analysis
- One-to-One Mentoring

One of the latest national LEO initiatives saw 5 local **dlr** businesses successfully secure a total of €125,000 in funding as part of the Innovation Investment Fund. As part of the application programme, all businesses received one-to-one mentoring and pitch training. At the conclusion, all 5 were successful in their formal pitch to an investor panel to secure the LEO grant.



Christmas tree **recycling**

After the festive period has ended, it will be time to dispose of your Christmas tree. Recycling will be available between 9.30am and 3.30pm from Tuesday 2 to Sunday 14 January 2018 inclusive, at the following locations:

- Blackrock Park Main Entrance
- Cabinteely Park Car Park
- Killiney Hill Car Park
- Marlay Park, Grange Road Car Park
- **dlr** Parks Depot, Sandyford Road (near Kilcross Estate)
- Shanganagh Recycling Centre Car Park
- West Pier Car Park, Dún Laoghaire

Remember, you can't leave in Christmas trees before or after these dates or outside the designated areas. The provisions of the Litter Pollution Acts 1997 – 2009 will apply.

One Christmas tree per car will also be accepted free of charge at the Ballyogan Recycling Park in January of next year, however the facility will be closed on New Year's Day.

What I do? My job is to ensure the financial wellbeing of the council. Be that through the preparation of a balanced revenue budget or the provision of a robust capital programme. It's important that budgets are balanced, not only in financial terms and against a backdrop of value for money and accountability, but also in consideration of the needs of the various stakeholders within the county - citizens, businesses and tourists alike.

Aside from ensuring adequate financial resources and good governance are in place, I interact closely with Council departments, supporting them in their delivery of projects and services. These include the Cherrywood SDZ development, the provision of housing schemes and the establishment of the new Music Generation programme.

What's involved in bringing the Annual Budget to Council for adoption? Consultation and lots of it! The budget is developed over a number of months in conjunction with all departments. The Elected Members, through the Corporate Policy Group, provide strategic direction to the process. Income and expenditure proposals are collated, with the merit of individual projects presented and then agreed with the Chief Executive and Management Team. A final submission of a draft budget is then presented to the Elected Members for consideration at the Annual Budget Meeting.

Most difficult part of the job? Finding the financial resources to fund all the excellent and innovative projects put forward. With funding being so tight, it can be extremely challenging to decide how best to fairly allocate budgets.

Most rewarding part of the job? The role is varied, exciting and no two days are ever the same. Being able to see the tangible results of your work realised through the delivery of programmes and services, whether it's a new road scheme, housing development, library programme, age friendly initiative, local enterprise innovation or community group that has been supported, is deeply rewarding.



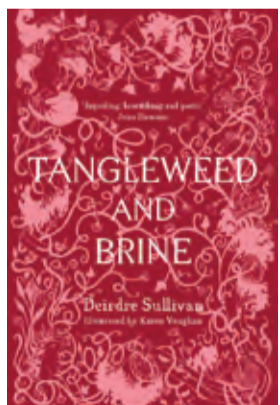
Starry, Starry Night

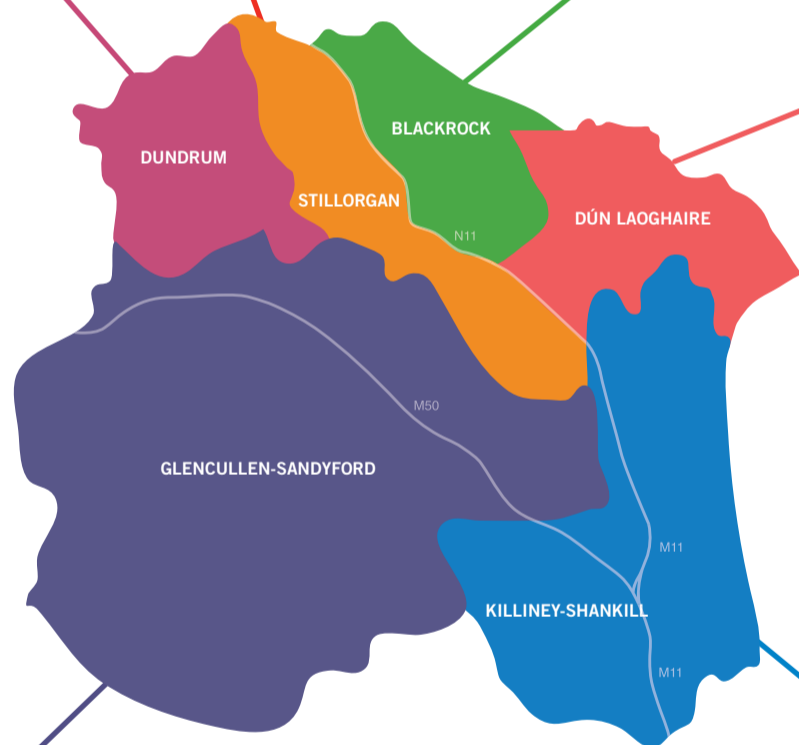
