Ireland's biggest triathlon this year, the IRONMAN 70.3, takes place in Dún Laoghaire this summer, attracting athletes from all over the country and around the globe.

This famous race is not for the faint hearted, which features a 1.9km swim from Sandycove. home to the famous Martello Tower, in the clear waters of the Irish Sea in Dublin Bay, before bringing athletes on a spectacular and challenging 90.1km bike course, travelling through some of the most scenic areas in our county. En route, participants will take in stunning coastal views while weaving their way through the streets of Dún Laoghaire for the 21.1km run, ultimately finishing at the famous Harbour.

IRONMAN started in 1978 on the island of Hawaii as a debate between navy seals. It centered around which athlete was the fittest: the swimmer, the cyclist or the runner. It was then decided that the only way to truly find out was to combine all three disciplines and complete them consecutively. On 18 February of that year, 15 people set out to complete a race in Hawaii thought to be impossible. Naval Commander, John Collins then famously said: "Whoever finishes, they will be called an IRONMAN."

Their dream created a community that believes ANYTHING IS POSSIBLE. Four decades later. hundreds of thousands of athletes fulfil these dreams at finish lines all over the world. This year the event celebrates its 40th anniversary and from this initial one race, the IRONMAN and IRONMAN 70.3 series has spawned 154 races internationally.



IRONMAN is more than a sport, it's a global movement that transcends geographic and cultural boundaries. It doesn't matter where you have raced or what your time was. Once you cross that start line, you join a family of hundreds of thousands of people from around the world, bound together by a single determination. You don't have to be an elite athlete either, as thousands of ordinary people join together for the competition. One takes on the swim, one the cycle and one the run. It's a competition for everyone.

Entries for IRONMAN 70.3 Dún Laoghaire are now open, but be quick as there are only a few hundred places remaining. For more details and entry details, head to the event website www.ironman.com/dunlaoghaire70.3

Access for all at Killiney beach



dlr is currently piloting a scheme to provide a beach wheelchair for use at Killiney beach this July and August. It is part of an initiative to improve accessibility for people with disabilities at the Council's beaches and bathing areas. This easy to manoeuvre, all-terrain wheelchair can be towed, pushed or self-propelled and can be used on the beach, or splashing in the sea.

The wheelchairs will be available free of charge. We are currently finalising an easy to use online booking system to register for and book the wheelchairs. You can find out more on our website and on our social media in the coming weeks.

A more detailed accessibility study is also being carried out at beaches and bathing areas at Killiney, Sandycove and Seapoint as part of this initiative. It involves examining issues such as parking and ramp access for people with disabilities.

World Class Sailing comes to Dún Laoghaire

Excitement is building along the waterfront in Dún Laoghaire in anticipation of the staging of the 2018 Laser Masters World Championships, a week-long event kicking off on 7 September.

The "Laser", in case you aren't a sailor, is a single-handed racing dinghy that measures a little over four metres in length. First seen in 1969, it has grown to become the world's most popular sailboat, with nearly 250,000 sold to date. In 1996 it became the Men's Olympic single-handed dinghy and in 2008, for the Beijing Olympics, it was introduced as the Women's single-handed. **Annalise Murphy**, from the National Yacht Club in Dún Laoghaire, rode one of these to an Olympic Silver in 2016 in Brazil.

Old soldiers may fade away, but old sailors, well, they just keep sailing. The Laser's popularity over the past 50 years has endeared it to many of the world's greatest sailing athletes. Each year they come together to compete for the coveted title of Master's champion. To qualify as a Master, competitors must be over 35 and meet the entry criteria set down by their national body governing the sport. Masters race in divisions according to their age, and while most of the athletes are aged in the 35 to 45 age bracket, some are in their seventies. These "Legends" are some of the world's finest yachtsmen.

dlr has played a key role in making this event possible, providing both financial support and facilities to the organisers, who won the right to hold the event after an international tendering process. The Royal St George Yacht Club and National Yacht Club will host and run the event, with the Harbour Company providing much needed space on the Carlisle Pier. Almost 400 sailors from over 40 countries will compete. Together with their extended families, an international race jury, officials and an army of over 200 volunteers, it means there will be plenty of activity around the town, making this essential public viewing.

dlr presents the Futures



There are more places to watch professional tennis than at Wimbledon or one of the four Grand Slams, as this year dlr is a key sponsor of the AIG Irish Open Tennis Championships. This professional event is an ITF \$25,000 Men's Futures tournament and a Ladies \$15,000 event. The action occurs from Sunday 29 July – Sunday 5 August and all happens at the beautiful Carrickmines Tennis Club.

The AIG Irish Open Tennis Championships will provide an opportunity for the local tennis community to experience top level tennis on their very own doorstep. It showcases the very best talent Ireland has to offer. Irish Davis Cup team members, Simon Carr and Peter Bothwell, will be in the draw and there will also be a number of Irish wild card entrants. tipped as the next generation of Irish players. The AIG Irish Open will likely also see the return of last year's Ladies finalist Sinead Lohan. There will be overseas players ranked from 150-350 in the ATP World Rankings looking to take home the top prize.

The ITF professional circuit acts a natural progression in the life of a full time tennis player. True legends of the game credit much of their success to their time spent on this tour.

With players like Andy Murray, Rafael Nadal, Roger Federer, John McEnroe, Anna Kournikova and Martina Hingis all having taken part in this kind of event early in their careers, this is a perfect opportunity to catch a star of the future.

The AIG Irish Open Tennis Championships is a wonderful chance for Irish sports lovers to witness history in the making at a club with a long history and important association with professional tennis. The Irish Open was the world's first combined men's and ladies tennis tournament and dates all the way back to 1879. and has previously been held in Fitzwilliam Lawn Tennis Club. This year Carrickmines, a member of the prestigious centenary tennis clubs for clubs older than one hundred years, is hosting proceedings. The AIG Irish Open Tennis Championships is the only professional men's and ladies tennis event being held in Ireland this year so don't miss this great opportunity to witness world class tennis on your doorstep.

dlr Summer of Heritage 2018



dlr Summer of Heritage returns with more tours celebrating the wealth of historical heritage in our county. The summer programme comprises a series of tours across these valued heritage sites with The Hotels of Kingstown/Dún Laoghaire Tour and 250 Years of Old Dunleary new for this year.

The Hotels of Kingstown/Dún Laoghaire Tour, which will run every Thursday at 5pm, looks at the history of Dún Laoghaire hotels. When the local harbour was constructed, the town became a major holiday destination and hotels were developed and flourished on the back of this. The number of hotels has greatly reduced over time, having either disappeared or been converted to other uses. This is the ideal chance to learn about the great hotel history of Dún Laoghaire!

The second new addition this summer is 250 Years of Old Dunleary, which tours every Thursday from 27 June to 29 August at 7pm. It looks at how the tiny fishing village of Dunleary, with its own little harbour, coffee house and Martello Tower, was transformed beyond recognition, first by the development of the "Royal Harbour" in 1818 and then by the railway in 1834. This culminated in the creation of a unique history of gasworks, chemical and tourism industries before maturing as a desirable office and residential location.



dlr wins gold medal at Bloom!

dlr was delighted to be awarded a Gold Medal at Bloom 2018 for our concept garden 'Fernhill - An exercise in sustainability' in the large concept garden category.

Our garden was designed in house by dlr Senior Parks Superintendent **Ruairí Ó Dúlaing** and Tierney Haines Architect **Nicola Haines.** The garden was planned and planted with ecological and sustainable plants and with a keen eye on the details.

This garden highlights the challenge for parks to balance protection of the environment with a human need for outside space. Fernhill has been recently acquired by dlr and will provide much-needed parkland for the local community. The park includes a unique collection of spring flowering ericaceous plants and is teeming with wildlife. We have a rigorous sustainability plan for the garden which keeps areas protected from disturbance, while offering alternative spaces for visitors to engage with this special place.

The show garden is an interpretation of the sustainability aims for Fernhill. A reclaimed birch-clad wall creates a divide between protected and active parts of the garden. Breaks in the wall encourage glimpses into the protected landscape. The wall breaks down to reveal a woodland playground, half in, half out of the protected environment and a community garden, complete with wheelchair accessible raised bed.

We will be reinstalling the Bloom garden in Fernhill later this year.

Bronntar bonn óir ar dlr ag Bloom!

Ba mhór ag dlr Bonn Óir a bhaint amach ag Bloom 2018 as ár ngairdín coincheapa 'Cnoc na Raithní – Beart ar son na hinbhuanaitheachta' in aicme na ngairdíní coincheapa móra.

Ruairí Ó Dúlaing, Stiúrthóir Sinsearach Páirceanna le dlr, agus **Nicola Haines,** ailtire le Tierney Haines, a dhear ár ngairdín go hinmheánach. Rinne an gairdín a phleanáil agus a chur faoi phlandaí éiceolaíocha inbhuanaithe agus coinníodh súil ghrinn ar na mionghnéithe ar fad.

Léirítear leis an ngairdín seo an dúshlán atá le sárú ag páirceanna chun an chothromaíocht a aimsiú idir cosaint an chomhshaoil agus an gá a bhíonn ag daoine le spásanna faoin aer. Cheannaigh dlr Cnoc na Raithní le déanaí agus fearann páirce, atá ag teastáil go géar, a bheidh ann do mhuintir na háite. Bíonn neart plandaí eiriceacha a thagann faoi bhláth san earrach le feiceáil sa pháirc gach bliain agus tá sí beo le fiadhúlra chomh maith. Táimid tar éis plean inbhuanaitheachta an-dian a chur le chéile don ghairdín, a fhágfaidh nach gcuirfear isteach ar áiteanna áirithe, agus a thabharfaidh deiseanna do chuairteoirí teacht i dteagmháil le spásanna éagsúla speisialta freisin.

Léiriú ar aidhmeanna inbhuanaitheachta Chnoc na Raithní a bheidh sa ghairdín taispeántais. Déantar limistéir chosanta agus limistéir ghníomhacha an ghairdín a scaradh le balla a bhfuil éadan beithe tarrtháilte air. Tá bearnaí sa bhalla, rud a spreagann cuairteoirí le féachaint tríothu ar an tírdhreach cosanta. Tá páirc spraoi choille, cuid di atá sa limistéar cosanta agus cuid di nach bhfuil, mar aon le gairdín pobail le ceapach ardaithe atá inrochtana do dhaoine i gcathaoir rothaí, le fáil ag ceann an bhalla.

Beidh an gairdín a thugamar go Bloom ag teacht ar ais go Cnoc na Raithní níos déanaí i mbliana.

New Cathaoirleach for Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown

Green Party Councillor Ossian Smyth, who has represented the residents of the Dún Laoghaire ward since his election in 2014, was elected Cathaoirleach at the Annual General Meeting of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council on 11 June.



Speaking after his election, he outlined his priorities for his term, which include further improvement in the delivery of Council services especially around promoting a greener county by a reduction in the use of pesticides, more electric vehicles in the Council fleet, safer cycling for schoolchildren and timely communication of water quality at beaches in the county. Ossian also identified the achievement of housing construction targets and the continuation of the energy upgrade programme for social housing as priorities for his term.

"It is a great honour to be elected Cathaoirleach of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown. I very much look forward to the next year as Cathaoirleach of our county and engaging with all stakeholders to continue to improve the services and facilities our Council has to offer".

Ossian was educated at Trinity College and works as an Information Systems Project Manager in St Vincent's Hospital. He also volunteers as a mentor at a local CoderDojo, teaching young people computer programming and other technical skills.

Councillor Mary Fayne was also elected Leas Chathaoirleach at the meeting. Councillor Fayne, a representative of the Fine Gael Party, was elected in the Dún Laoghaire Local Electoral Area in 2014. Born and raised in Dún Laoghaire, Councillor Fayne was educated in St Mary's Dominican Convent, and has strong ties with Cuala GAA Club and Seapoint Rugby Club.

dlr delivers new social houses under Rebuilding Ireland Programme



dlr was recently joined by Minister of State Damien English at the launch of 12 new homes in Dún Laoghaire's George's Place.

The houses were designed in-house by dlr's Architects' Department, with construction by John Sisk & Son on a rapid build programme. Three further homes were delivered in Blackrock. 137 new units are being created at various locations throughout the county, with completion scheduled for 2018.

The development in George's Place

consists of 12 houses in total, ten 2-bed terraced and two 2-bed semi-detached. This project has provided much needed dwellings, all built to the highest environmental standards in line with our ethos of providing our tenants with bright, spacious, comfortable living spaces coupled with superb indoor air quality and low running costs.

Each home was designed to a very high specification, incorporating the latest innovations and build technology, resulting in ultra-modern, energy efficient and high quality houses. With near Zero Energy Buildings 'nZEB' due to become mandatory for all housing stock in the near future, these homes demonstrate how this can be achieved cost effectively, all on a rapid build programme on a

The provision of social and affordable housing is the Council's main priority with dlr actively working towards achieving its housing delivery target of 1,563 social housing homes by 2021.

Civic Hub update



dlr's new Civic Hub and Council Chamber opened for business on on 11 June. The Civic Hub provides a comprehensive and integrated space, delivering a wide-ranging service to our customers.

The licence is free for an advertising board, display rack or plant stand. Up to two tables and four chairs can also be licensed at no charge, with any additional items incurring an extra cost.

dlr staff profile



Ruairí **Ó Dúlaing** CHIEF OF PARKS

Ruairí is a graduate of UCD and has spent most of his professional life working in the design, maintenance and

management of public parks and open spaces spanning Dublin, South Dublin and Fingal. He has been Chief of Parks in Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown for the last year and a half.

What do you do?

I manage the parks section of dlr which encompasses parks, cemeteries, sports, heritage and biodiversity. It is a large and varied portfolio, which involves approximately 120 staff based both at County Hall and in works depots around the county. The section covers the flagship areas at Marlay, Cabinteely, Shanganagh, Kilboggett, Killiney Hill, The People's Park, and now Fernhill Park & Gardens in Stepaside. We are also responsible for a number of smaller neighbourhood parks and public open spaces located in housing estates and roadside margins, roundabouts and over 50,000 street trees. We manage the large cemeteries at Deansgrange and Shanganagh, as well as the older closed cemeteries around the county. The sports office is a dynamic place covering the management of facilities and works to maximise participation in sport. Heritage is particularly important in dlr, and we are proud of the frequency and variety of free heritage events that are offered throughout the year. The management and maintenance of the heritage properties in Marlay and Cabinteely are an integral part of our work. I report back to the Director of Municipal Services and the Chief Executive, while liaising regularly with the elected members.

What is your typical work day like?

My average work day involves many meetings, both formal and ad hoc. No two days are alike, and I try to balance as much as possible the need to be present in my office, or out at meetings in County Hall or at the many sites where our work can bring us. The many communication tools of modern life tend to dominate my day, and often stretch the hours of work at both ends! I would say that there's no such thing as an average day. Anything could happen, and I never quite know what the next call, email, text or tweet might bring.

What is the most difficult part of your job?

Time management for the reasons outlined above!

What is the most rewarding part of your job?

I am very lucky to work in a department full of talented and enthusiastic people. I find it very rewarding when this talent and teamwork combine and achieve excellence results. I am equally lucky that the work that we do impacts positively on the lives of people, whether it's in a playground, woodland, playing pitch, or even something as simple as a bench provided in a beautiful place.

Baths **Redevelopment**



Works on the dlr Baths Redevelopment are well underway with demolition works expected to be completed in July.

The demolition of the building was undertaken in stages, and involved the clearance of hazardous materials from the site. Items such as old turnstiles, towel drying racks, etc are being retained and were safely removed. Lead paint was also stripped from the walls to allow them to be free from contaminants before demolishing. The old pool structures are being demolished with the old piers also being taken away. A temporary structure is being created to support the front face and two side of the pavilion building adjacent to Windsor Terrace which are being retained.

When this initial work is completed, construction of the new pier will commence. This poses a number of challenges, as the formation level for the pier is below low tide level. The height difference between low and high tides can be up to 4 metres. so ensuring that the works are protected and kept in place while concrete is setting is vital. Divers are being used by the contractor to set up shutters in preparation for concrete pours at low tide. Biodegradable shuttering oils will be employed to ensure that there is no contamination to the sea. A special concrete mix will ensure that the concrete is not washed out during high tide.

The main structure of the pier is expected to be in place by September.

National Public Library Strategy launch

Our newly elected Cathaoirleach, Cllr Ossian Smyth, and Michael Ring, T.D. Minister for Rural and Community Development, officially launched the National Public Library Strategy 2018-2022 at the dlr Lexicon recently.

The new strategy will underpin the continued development of public libraries, positioning them at the centre of the community, while meeting the information, learning and cultural needs of everyone. This ambitious five year plan will see fines abolished and opening hours extended. It will also continue to enhance digital and technology capacity across the service. This will include digital learning centres in suitable libraries, which will see the extension of the My Open Library Service to up to 100 libraries by 2023.

Suffragist City: Women and the Vote in Dublin,

a touring exhibition on loan from Dublin City Public Libraries

Level 3, dlr Lexicon, 8 June-31 July 2018

In February 1918, the Representation of the People Act was passed, and women who were over 30 years of age were finally allowed to vote. Eleven months later, the voters of Dublin elected Constance Markievicz who became the first woman to win a seat at Westminster. Suffragism was the conviction that votes should be extended to women. By the early years of the twentieth century, the campaign had gained sufficient momentum to be regularly debated

The 1910s was a decade of great social and political turbulence. The Home Rule crisis, labour unrest, the outbreak of the First World War, and the Easter Rising splintered the cosy certainties of the British Empire. The cause of suffragism added to the tumult, as women asserted their political rights. Suffragists in Ireland endured ridicule, assault, and imprisonment in their quest for social justice, but 1918 was their year of victory. This exhibition tells their story.
