## RE: CONTROL OF DOGS ACT 1986

## <u>SECTION 25 – DOG BARKING</u>

The Procedure in relation to barking dogs is as follows:

- **1.** The complainant contacts the District Court Clerk in Dun Laoghaire Court on Corrig Avenue, Dun Laoghaire; phone no. 01 280 0038. The Clerk will then give a time and date for the case.
- **2.** The Complainant then completes the attached notice and serves it on the owner of the dogs(s) concerned.
- **3.** The Justice will hear the case on the appointed date and may make one of three decisions as listed on the notice.

It is also advisable to make a note of the day/nights and times that the nuisance is caused. This may be of benefit if and when the case is heard in Court.
