

Brian Gallagher. Shankill Library, March 13th at 10.30am for 5th to 6th class

Brian is a writer whose plays and short stories have been produced in Ireland, Britain and Canada. He has worked extensively in radio and television, writing dramas and documentaries. Brian has written many exciting novels based on real events in Irish history for young readers, including: One Good Turn, Friend or Foe, Stormclouds, Secrets and Shadows, Taking Sides, Across the Divide, Arrivals, Pawns,



Spies and Winds of Change. Brian lives with his family in Dublin. His latest book, *The Case of the Vanishing Painting*, is the first in a new adventure series set in Dublin in 1911 as twins Deirdre and Tim must solve a daring robbery.

Ellen is a writer and journalist from County Wicklow, who has contributed to the *Irish Independent* and *Irish Times*, among other media. Her debut book, *Girls Who Slay Monsters: Daring Tales of Ireland's Forgotten Goddesses* won both the Children's Books Ireland KPMG Book of the Year Award and the Children's Books Ireland KPMG Junior Juries Award, 2023, as voted for by thousands of young readers across Ireland. *Girls*

Who Slay Monsters also won Children's Book of the Year: Senior at the An Post Irish Book Awards 2022.

Ellen is an award-winning children's author based in Dublin. She has written a wide range of children's books, including *Where Are You*, *Puffling?* (with illustrator Gerry Daly) and *Tabitha Plimtock and the Edge of the World* (with illustrations by Phillip Cullen), which was awarded a White Raven by the International Youth Library.


Natasha Mac a'Bháird. dlr Lexlcon. 9th April at 10.am and 11.30am for 3rd to 6th class.

Peter previously worked in feature animation for many years where he developed his love for Story Art. He lives in Co Wicklow.

Paul is an author, journalist and comedy writer best known as the creator of the Ross O'Carroll-Kelly series, which have sold over one million copies and are critically acclaimed as satirical masterpieces. 
Úna Woods. Deansgrange Library. 12th March at 10am and 11.30am for Senior Infants and 1st class.


Spooktacular Place to Be. Her new children's book, A Blooming Great Day, is a fun picture book adventure set on Bloomsday!

Sinéad is the much-loved author of 16 adult novels, and her books have been translated into 25 languages. Sinéad has won over readers and critics by telling stories that are humane, moving and relevant, and her children's books are now inspiring a new generation of readers. *The New Girl*, her debut children's fiction, won the An Post Award for Teen and Young Adult Book of the Year in 2021. *The Truth About Riley* was nominated the following year in the same category.



Shane Hegarty. dlr Lexicon. March 5th at 10am for Senior Infants/1st class and 11.30am for 2nd to 4th class.



Shane is a children's writer and journalist. Formerly Arts Editor of *The Irish Times*, his first children's series *Darkmouth* was nominated for the Waterstones Prize and an Irish Book Award. His most recent series *'Boot'* was nominated for the Sainsbury's Children's Book Awards, An Post Irish Book Awards and was selected as the Dublin UNESCO City of Literature CityWide Read for 2020. His writing has been translated into over 15 languages

worldwide. He is also a columnist for The Sunday Times.

Sinéad O'Hart. Dundrum Library. April 4th at 10am and 11.30am for 4th to 6th class

Sinéad is a children's author, a children's literature podcaster (she co-hosts Storyshaped, available on all podcasting platforms) and a parent, all of which keeps her busy (but not too busy to read). She's the author of The Eye of the North, The Star-Spun Web, Skyborn, The Time Tider and The Silver Road, and sometimes she can't quite believe she's lucky enough to do what she loves most (putting fictional people into frankly dangerous situations) as a job!

Marita is one of Ireland's best-loved, award-winning children's authors. She has written numerous best-selling books for adults and children, and they have been translated into many languages. *Under the Hawthorn* Tree, her first novel, became an immediate bestseller and has been described as 'the biggest success story in children's historical fiction'. Its



sequels, Wildflower Girl and Fields of Home, have also been hugely successful. Marita's other books include The Blue Horse, No Goodbye, Safe Harbour, In Deep Dark Wood, A Girl Called Blue and Fairy Hill. Marita is a winner of the International Reading Association Award, the Osterreichischer Kinder und Jugendbuchpreis, the Reading Association of Ireland Award, and the Children's Books Ireland Children's Book of the Year Award. She is a former Chairperson of Irish PEN. Her work has been adapted for stage and TV.

Sarah Webb. Stillorgan Library. May 16th at 10am and 11.15am for 3rd to 5th class.

Sarah is an award-winning children's writer. Her books include Blazing a Trail: Irish women who Changed the World (illustrated by Lauren O'Neill) and A Sailor Went to Sea, Sea, Sea: Favourite Rhymes from an Irish Childhood (illustrated by Steve McCarthy), both winners of Irish Book Awards. Passionate about bringing children and books together, Sarah was awarded the Children's Books Ireland Award for Outstanding Contribution to Children's Books in Ireland. Her latest novel for children is The Little Beekeeper of Henrietta Street (illustrated by Rachel Corcoran), set in Dublin in 1911.

Paul O'Flynn is an RTÉ News and Sport presenter and journalist. A graduate of DCU with a BA in Journalism and an MA in International Relations, he is also currently an associate lecturer at his alma mater. He is a keen sportsperson and amateur swimmer, and in 2018 he was the winner of the Liffey Swim. His Irish Sporting Legends biographies include *King Henry; Go, Johnny, Go!; and Josh the Fly*

Briana is an award-winning author, anti-racism advocate, educator and DEI specialist who grew up in Yonkers, New York and has lived in Ireland since 2017. She was a secondary school teacher for 13 years and has been working in the area of anti-racism since 2021. With her passion for social justice, one of Briana's main goals is to empower teachers and young people with the tools they need to make sure that everyone is seen, heard and feels a sense of belonging in all educational spaces. Her award-winning book, *Black & Irish:* Legends, Trailblazers and Everyday Heroes was published in 2023 and is being widely used in schools across the country. Briana is also the co-founder of SPARK Teachers, a pan-



European community for racialised teachers, in collaboration with the European Network Against Racism. Briana was named one of the "50 to Watch in 2024" by The Irish Times. She lives in Co. Kildare with her partner and two children and is proud to call Ireland home.

Leon Diop is a mixed-race man from Tallaght, Dublin, Ireland. Born to an Irish mother and a Senegalese father, he

grew up in a mixed ethnic and religious household. He studied Psychology in Maynooth University where he served two years as Students' Union President. He is the founder of Black and Irish, an organisation striving to transform Ireland into a global leader in equality and inclusion. He is a host of the Black and Irish podcast with Irish national broadcaster, RTÉ. He currently serves on the boards of the Childhood Development Initiative, and Tallaght and South Dublin County Partnership.
