ROAD CLOSURES

SECTION 75 OF THE ROADS ACT, 1993 EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF ADELAIDE ROAD

Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council's Road Maintenance Section has requested an extension to the temporary closure of Adelaide Road from the junction of Silchester Road to its Junction with Eden Road Lower and Hudson Road from **Friday**, **26**th **June 2020 to Friday**, **17**th **July 2020**.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation and local access will be maintained at all times and diversion routes will be clearly signposted.

The purpose of the closure is to facilitate road restoration and associated works.

Adelaide Road will be closed from the Junction of Silchester Road to its Junction with Eden Road Lower and Hudson Road for the duration of the works.

- A ONE-WAY SYSTEM will be in operation between the Junction of Station Road and Eden Road / Hudson Road.
- There will be NO ACCESS to Adelaide Road from the Junction of Eden Road Lower and Hudson Road.
- LOCAL ACCESS will be maintained via the Junction of Silchester Road.
- LOCAL EGRESS will be maintained via the Junction of Eden Road / Hudson Road.
- Works will be undertaken during the hours of 08:00 and 18:00 hrs.
- Advance notice of diversion routes will be clearly signposted on all approaches.
- Traffic Management Arrangements will remain in place over night for the duration of the works.

SECTION 75 OF THE ROADS ACT, 1993 TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF ST. FINTAN'S PARK

Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council has received an application from Cleary and Doyle Construction Ltd. for the temporary closure of St. Fintan's Park, Dean's Grange from its junction with Abbey Road to 20m past the Junction with Abbey Court housing estate and Grange Abbey Apartments from **Monday**, **29**th **June 2020** to **Friday**, **3**rd **July 2020**.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation and local access will be maintained at all times and diversion routes will be clearly signposted.

The purpose of the closure is to facilitate road resurfacing works.

ROADWORKS / LANE RESTRICTIONS

» Coastal Mobility Interventions ***

DLR has prepared a plan to implement coastal mobility interventions to reallocate space to cyclists and pedestrians. Details of the scheme are available here: <u>https://www.dlrcoco.ie/en/news/general-news-press-releases/new-coastal-mobility-interventions-dlr</u>

To facilitate the measures the following vehicular restrictions are being put in place:

- Seapoint Avenue One-Way for vehicles from Newtown Avenue to Coal Quay Bridge/York Road Junction. Vehicles will travel west along this route (towards Blackrock).
- A small section of two-way road for vehicles will be provided from the West Pier Campus to Link Road (at the Purty Kitchen). This is to enable easy access to the homes and businesses, as there is **no Left turn** allowed from Clarence Street onto Seapoint Avenue.
- **Queen's Road will be One-Way** from Park Road junction (at the People's Park) to the entrance to the Lexicon Library and Pavilion car parks (westbound towards Dún Laoghaire).
- Queen's Road, at the Park Road junction, to Sandycove Avenue West will be one-way eastbound for vehicles, i.e. towards the Forty Foot.

Works are scheduled to commence on **Monday**, **29**th **June 2020** and take approximately <u>4-5 weeks</u>.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in place and diversion routes will be signed.

Blackrock Village Scheme – Covid 19 Public Realm Project ***

Richard Nolan Civil Engineering Ltd. have been appointed by Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council to undertake the **One-Way Scheme** along **Rock Hill and Main Street** in Blackrock village as part of Covid-19 temporary measures in the public realm in DLR. The scheme includes the temporary widening of footpaths and installation of a contra flow cycle lane to facilitate social distancing measures within the Blackrock Village. The works will be carried out in two phases as follows:

Phase 1: Commence site works on Monday, 8th June 2020:

- Install one-way system using a system of black pencil bollards, carry out changes to traffic signals and install new traffic signage, complete line marking.
- Remove any redundant signage and remove or reposition any existing street furniture to optimize available space.

Phase 2: Commence site works on Monday, 29th June 2020:

- Install 'narrow lane defender' separators between one-way traffic lane and reallocated space on both sides of Rock Hill/Main Street.
- Install anti-skid on reallocated space.
- Complete remaining line marking.
- Install planters and street furniture.

A Traffic Management Plan with a one-way system will be in place and diversion routes clearly signposted.

- Close off Left lane from Frascati Road to Carysfort Avenue with cones and barriers to be positioned along kerb edge for Phase 1 works. Following completion of works in Left lane, Traffic Management will swap over to Right hand lane.
- Permanent Traffic lights at Bath Place will be adjusted for one-way system.
- Works will be undertaken during the hours of 08:00 and 23:00 hrs.
- Advance notice of diversion routes will be clearly sign posted on all approaches to Blackrock Village.
- Traffic Management arrangements will remain in place overnight for the duration of the works.

» N11 – Southbound (between Stillorgan Park Junction and Brewery Road Junction) **

Upgrading of public lighting columns and lanterns. Work will commence on Monday 29th June 2020 until <u>Friday, 28th August 2020</u> (intermittent) from 10:00 to 16:00 hrs. and 19:30 to Midnight (if required).

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation for the duration of the works.

» Lower Kilmacud Road, Stillorgan ***

Public realm upgrade works will commence on Monday, 29th June 2020 from the Old Church to the pedestrian crossing at Stillorgan Shopping Centre.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in place for the duration of the works.

» R 831 – Marine Terrace and Marine Parade, Dún Laoghaire *

Investigation slit trenches will commence on Saturday, 27th June 2020, for one day, between 07:00 and 16:00 hrs.

A Stop / Go Traffic Management Plan will be in place for the duration of the works.

Protected Cycle Routes - Various Locations around the County ***

Installation of flexible bollards at junctions around the County to commence **Monday**, **29th June 2020** and will take place over a period of <u>two to three weeks</u> between 10.00 and 16:00 hrs. Some of the works may proceed at night

Dundrum Area

- 1. Kilmacud Road Lower/Eden and Drummartin Road junction
- 2. Blackthorn Road and Blackthorn Drive (near the Beacon Hospital)
- 3. Blackthorn Road / Blackthorn Drive / Benildus Avenue Junction
- 4. Churchtown Road / Beaumont Avenue Junction
- 5. Barton Road East / Balinteer Road Junction

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation at each location for the duration of the works.

Nutgrove Avenue (from Oakdown Road to Beaumont Avenue) **

Junction upgrades and cycle path works will continue until Friday, 3^{rd} July 2020 between 08:00 and 18:00 hrs.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation.

Lower Kilmacud Road, Stillorgan **

Road works will continue until Friday, <u>3rd July</u> 2020 between 08:00 and 18:00 hrs.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation.

Churchtown Road Upper (St. Nahi's Church) **

Installation of a foul sewer is complete, resurfacing works will commence and continue until 10^{th} July 2020.

A Stop / Go Traffic Management Plan will be in operation during the resurfacing.

Adelaide Road – (24-hour Road Closure) ***

Road Restoration works and associated 24-hour Road Closure will continue on **Adelaide Road** until 17^{th} July 2020.

Adelaide Road will be closed from the junction of Silchester Road to its Junction with Eden Road Lower and Hudson Road for the duration of the works.

From Monday, 25th May 2020:

- A ONE-WAY SYSTEM will be in operation between the Junction of Station Road and Eden Road / Hudson Road.
- There will be NO ACCESS to Adelaide Road from the Junction of Eden Road Lower and Hudson Road.
- LOCAL ACCESS for will be maintained via the junction of Silchester Road.
- LOCAL EGRESS will be maintained via the junction of Eden Road / Hudson Road.
- Works will be undertaken during the hours of 08:00 hrs. and 18:00hrs.
- Advance notice of diversion routes will be clearly sign posted on all approaches.
- Traffic Management Arrangements will remain in place over night for the duration of the works.

Wyattville Link Road, Cherrywood ***

Road works in the northern verge and central median of the Wyattville Link Road between Tullyvale and the M50 will continue until <u>October 2020</u>.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation.

Stillorgan Road (UCD Access) Cycle Improvement Scheme ***

Provision of footpaths, cycleways, junction buildouts, new kerbing, new traffic signal layout and toucan crossing, relocated bus stops and associated works, street lighting, soft landscaping, utility provision and utility diversions and all associated works recommenced on Monday, 18th May 2020 and will continue until <u>30th November</u> 2020 between 08:00 and 20:00 hrs.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation.

Public Lighting Lantern and Bracket Upgrade Works **

Public lighting lantern and bracket upgrade works will take place on:

- 1. Glenageary Road Lower
- 2. Killiney Road
- 3. Tivoli Road
- 4. Avondale Road
- 5. Ballinclea Road
- 6. Leopardstown Road
- 7. Glenageary Road upper
- 8. Woodbine Road
- 9. Vico Road
- 10. Monkstown Road

These works will continue until <u>31st July 2020</u>.

A Stop / Go Traffic Management Plan will be in operation as required.

Windsor Terrace – Dún Laoghaire Baths Redevelopment **

During **June / July** the building will be made weather tight. Structural concrete walls, including sea walls will continue. Installation of pedestrian deck will commence. There should be no Traffic Management restrictions on Windsor Terrace except for the delivery of materials, which will be short-term and between 10:00 and 16:00 hrs. - Monday to Friday.
