ROAD CLOSURES

SECTION 75 OF THE ROADS ACT. 1993 TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF SWEETBRIAR LANE, KILMACUD, DUBLIN 14 ***

Dun Laoghaire Rathdown Co Co has approved the closure of Sweetbriar Lane, Kilmacud, Dublin 14, from the junction of Kilmacud Road Lower to the junction of Slieve Rua Drive from Monday 28th February 2022 to Monday 14th March 2022.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation and local and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. Diversion routes will be clearly signposted.

The purpose of the closure is to facilitate construction of an active travel scheme on behalf of DLR County Council.

PROPOSED ROAD CLOSURES

SECTION 75 OF THE ROADS ACT. 1993 TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF MOUNT MERRION AVENUE

Dún Laoghaire Rathdown County Council has received an application from Roadstone on behalf of Transport Infrastructure Ireland to temporarily close Mount Merrion Avenue from the junction with Rock Road to the junction with Cross Avenue.

It is proposed that the closure take place between 7:30 pm and 5:30 am from Monday the 21st of March 2022 to the Sunday the 3rd of April 2022. The purpose of the closure is to facilitate plaining and line marking works. These works will take place at night because of high traffic volumes during the day.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation and local access will be maintained at all times. Diversion routes will be clearly signposted.

» SECTION 75 OF THE ROADS ACT. 1993 TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF ENNISKERRY ROAD, STEPASIDE, DUBLIN 18.

Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council has received an application from the Stepaside Business Association for the temporary closure of a section of Enniskerry Road, from the junction of Rosemont School and Fernhill Park through Stepaside Village to the junction with Glenamuck Road South from 1.30 p.m.to 6.00 p.m. on Thursday 17th March, 2022.

The purpose of the closure is to facilitate a St. Patrick's Day Parade and associated events in Stepaside Village.

Diversion of traffic will be via Hillcrest Road, Kilgobbin Road, Ballyogan Road and Glenamuck Road South and vice versa.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in place and the diversion routes will be clearly signposted.

SECTION 75 OF THE ROADS ACT. 1993 TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF BLACKGLEN ROAD, SANDYFORD, DUBLIN 18

Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council has received an application from Murphy Ireland Ltd to temporarily close Blackglen Road, Sandyford, Dublin 18, between the two junctions with Ticknock Park (Ticknock Park/ Ticknock Drive ,including Ticknock Hill section of road and Simons Ridge section of road also known as the "Link Road"), from Monday 28th February 2022 to Monday 5th September 2022.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation and local access will be maintained at all times. Diversion routes will be clearly signposted.

The purpose of the closure is to facilitate construction of the Blackglen Road Improvement Scheme on behalf of DLR County Council.

SPEED LIMIT ORDER

Road Works <u>Speed Limit</u> Order, No.1 of 2021 on the <u>M50</u> Motorway in the County of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown

Notice is hereby given that Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council, in exercise of the powers under Section 10 of the Road Traffic Act, 2004, in the interests of road safety and to facilitate the M50 Traffic Flow Optimisation Construction Project; has made an Order entitled Road Works Speed Limit Order, No.1 of 2021 on the M50 motorway in the County of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown to apply a road works speed limit as follows:

M50 Northbound will run from 03 August 2021 until 31 March 2022 or until the end of the works, whichever is the earlier.

Description of Speed Limit order 80km/hr:

- Part of the Northbound M50 between a point 335 metres South of the existing Crinken Lane overbridge to a point 165 metres North of the Crinken Lane overbridge (Total 500m in length).
- Part of the Northbound M50 between a point 165 metres North of the existing Crinken Lane overbridge to a point 300 metres West of the R113 overbridge (Total 8000m in length).
- Part of the Northbound M50 diverge at Junction 17 (M11 Junction 4) from the start of the diverge taper to a point on the diverge ramp 70 metres North of the Lordello Road overbridge (Total 450m in length).
- Part of the Northbound M50 diverge at Junction 16 from the start of the diverge taper to a point on the diverge ramp 55 metres East of the stop line of the diverge off-ramp at Junction 16 (Total 605m in length).
- Part of the Northbound M50 merge at Junction 16 from a point 80 metres West of the start of the merge on-ramp at M50 Junction 16 to the end of the merge taper (Total 700m in length).
- Part of the Northbound M50 diverge at Junction 15 from the start of the diverge taper to a point on the diverge ramp 130 metres East of the stop line of the diverge off-ramp at Junction 15 (Total 500m in length).
- Part of the Northbound M50 merge at Junction 15 from a point 35 metres North
 of the start of the merge on-ramp at M50 Junction 15 to the end of the merge
 taper
 (Total 590m in length).
- Part of the Northbound M50 diverge at Junction 13 from the start of the diverge taper to a point on the diverge ramp 420 metres East of the stop line of the diverge off-ramp at Junction 13 (Total 480m in length).

M50 Southbound will run from 01 November 2021 until 31 October 2022 or until the end of the works, whichever is the earlier.

Description of speed limit order 80km/hr:

- Part of the Southbound M50 between a point 120 metres South of the existing R117 overbridge to a point 620 metres South of the R117 overbridge (Total 500m in length).
- Part of the Southbound M50 diverge at Junction 14 from the start of the diverge taper to a point on the diverge ramp 420 metres West of the yield line of the diverge off-ramp at Junction 14 (Total 485m in length).
- Part of the Southbound M50 between a point 620 metres South of the existing R117 Overbridge to a point 120 metres South of the M11 Overbridge (M50 Junction 17/M11 J4) (Total 8,000m in length).
- Part of the Southbound M50 merge at Junction 13 from a point 50 metres East of the start of the merge on-ramp at M50 Junction 13 to the end of the merge taper (Total 1250m in length).
- Part of the Southbound M50 diverge at Junction 15 from the start of the diverge taper to a point on the diverge ramp 40 metres West of the stop line of the diverge off-ramp at Junction 15 (Total 555m in length).
- Part of the Southbound M50 merge at Junction 15 from a point 75 metres South
 of the start of the merge on-ramp at M50 Junction 15 to the end of the merge
 taper
 (Total 480m in length).
- Part of the Southbound M50 diverge at Junction 16 from the start of the diverge taper to a point on the diverge ramp 60 metres West of the stop line of the diverge off-ramp at Junction 16 (Total 525m in length).
- Part of the Southbound M50 merge at Junction 16 from a point 65 metres South
 of the start of the merge on-ramp at M50 Junction 16 to the end of the merge
 taper
 (Total 575m in length).

The Garda Commissioner has been notified by email of the Council's intention **to decrease the Speed Limit** to **80 km/hr** on the **M50** Southbound and Northbound, in accordance with Section 10 of the Road Traffic Act, 2004.

A Stop / Go Traffic Management Plan will be in operation.

» Monkstown Road, Monkstown **

GMC utilities on behalf of Irish Water will commence drinking water upgrade works from 28th February and continue until to 01st March, between the hours of 08:00 to 18:00.

A Stop/Go Traffic Management Plan will be in operation.

» Mount Merrion Road to N11 Stillorgan Road Jct. to Cross Avenue Junction **

Civil works, road planing to take place at N31 Merrion Road to N11 Stillorgan Road Junction to Cross Avenue Junction, commencing Monday 07th March until Friday the 11th March 2022, between the hours of 10:00 and 16:00.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in place.

» Mount Merrion Road to N11 Stillorgan Road Jct. to Cross Avenue Junction ** (NIGHT WORKS)

Civil works, resurfacing to take place at N31 Merrion Road to N11 Stillorgan Road Junction to Cross Avenue Junction, commencing Thursday 10th March until Friday the 11th March 2022, between the hours of 19:30 and 05:00.

Local diversions will be in place.

Ballyedmonduff Road, Stepaside*

Subject to the availability of the line marking contractor, road marking and installation of studs will continue here from to Friday 11^{th} March 2022. The works will take place between 10:00 and 18:00 hrs.

A traffic management plan will be in place.

Castlepark Road, Dalkey, Co. Dublin **

Sewer upgrade works on behalf of Irish Water will continue from 07th March and continue until to 11th March, between the hours of 08:00 to 18:00.

A Stop/Go Traffic Management Plan will be in operation.

Maple Road**

Footpath reconstruction works to continue on Maple Road, Clonskeagh to 11th March between the hours of 08.00 and 18:00 hrs.

A Stop / Go Traffic Management Plan will be in operation.

Meadow Mount, Churchtown, D14**

Overlay and road marking works to continue at the above location until Friday 18^{th} March from 08.00 and 18:00 hrs.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation.

Roebuck Road, Clonskeagh *** (Night Works)

In addition to lining and raising of ironworks, the installation of bollards on Roebuck Road will continue until $11^{\rm th}$ March

A Traffic Management Plan will be in place.

Trees Road, Mount Merrion, Co. Dublin **

Pedestrian improvement works at Trees Avenue, Cherry Garth, The Rise Junctions. Pedestrian Crossing installation and footpath build out works from 10th March to 11th March 2022, between 10:00 and 16:00 hrs.

A Stop / Go Traffic Management Plan in certain phases and a kerb side works set up will be in operation.

Torca Road, Dalkey Co. Dublin **

Footpath and bituminous patching works to continue at the above location from Monday 28th February to 14th March from 08.00 and 18:00 hrs.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation.

Ballinteer Road, Ballinteer ***

Ongoing works on wall at Dundrum Wood have ceased for the moment but a new footpath layout has been implemented and will be maintained until the issues with a dangerous wall are resolved.

A Traffic Management Plan will be in operation.

Blackglen Road Improvement Scheme ***

Murphy International Ltd. has been appointed by Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council to carry out the construction of this scheme.

Traffic Management will be in place from October 2021 at various locations along Blackglen Road, Lamb's Cross junction and the junction of Harold's Grange Road and College Road.

The construction stage of the scheme will last for approximately 18 months (April 2023).

Updates to this notice will be provided as the works progress.

Woodbrook Downs, Shankill***

Works at Woodbrook College are complete; however, road works will continue on the R119 Dublin Road at Woodbrook Downs.

A traffic light controlled shuttle system will be implemented daily between 10.00 & 16.00 Monday to Friday for a period of approximately 8 weeks and delays should be expected during working hours.
