Fiona's work explores the world of self-storage facilities through documentary photography. Her exhibition includes images of these spaces and interesting portraits of the people that use them. The installation by Catherine consists of an assemblage of unwanted clothes that are heaped in the corner of the Gallery space. These are produced by actions such as random piling, loose stacking and dropping, allowing the assemblage to shift and move in unpredictable ways emphasising the nature of the material.
