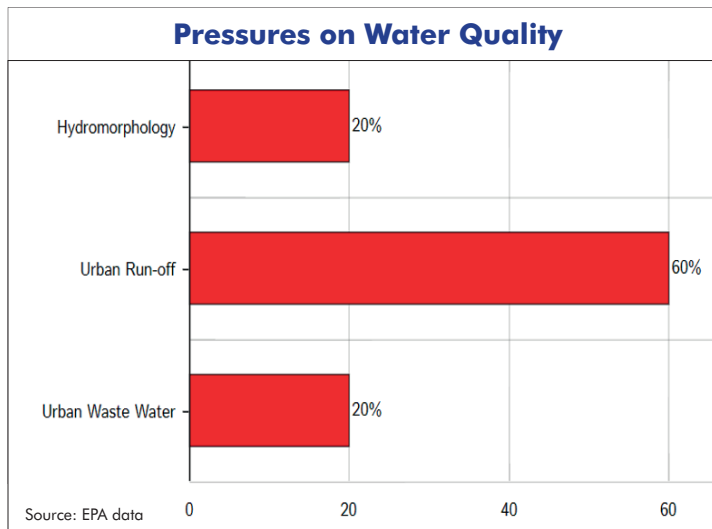
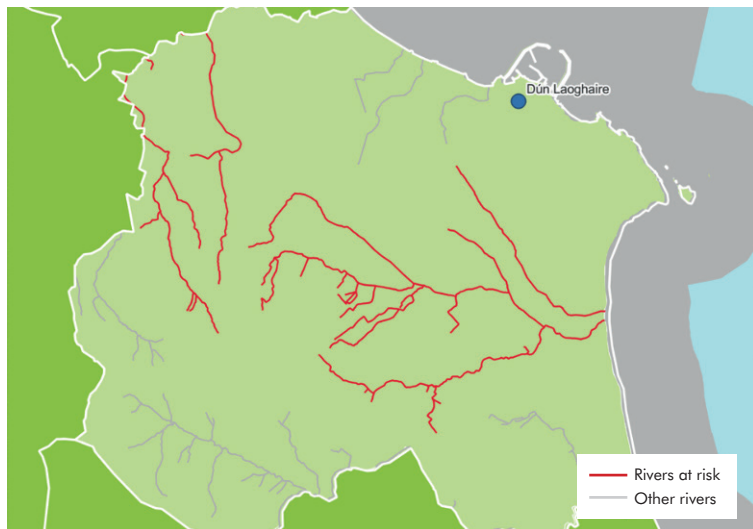

A significant number of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown rivers and streams are failing to meet good water quality standards. The main causes are urban wastewater, surface water run-off, and physical changes to our rivers (Hydromorphology). Poor water quality harms public health, wildlife, and local water amenities. Flooding and drought because of climate change are also

major factors that need to be considered. Urgent action is needed to protect and restore our vital water resources.

These meetings will provide you with information on water quality in Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown waters, with time for discussion on local issues. Your views on what needs to be done are important.
