Street Bin Review

March 2021

Introduction

Annual reviews related to the street bin service are conducted by the Cleansing Section of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council, the last one being in March of 2020. Each review looks at the distribution of bins across the county, the frequency of individual bin collections, the misuse of bins at some locations and the requests for removal or installation of bins since the previous review.

The emergence of Covid-19 has created unique challenges for the bin service and these difficulties have been addressed throughout the year. As a result, DLR's Cleansing Section conducted a restructuring of the bin service to match the dynamic changes to demand due to Covid-19. It remains essential that any decisions made in relation to improving the street bin service are in line with corporate Goals 1 & 5 of the Corporate Plan 2020-2024 which aim to promote a clean and healthy environment. This document is a non-exhaustive synopsis on the 'bin service' which outlines the findings of the 'March 2021 Street Bin Review'

Covid-19

One of the consequences following the emergence of Covid-19 restrictions was a sudden shift in consumer habits. A dynamic shift in eating habits was noted when food sales in seated venues were strongly curtailed in line with Covid-19 legislation. This led to a significant rise in take-out meals and a subsequent surge in waste generation in the public realm.

The enormous waste increases witnessed during the Covid-19 out-break placed the bin service at breaking point. Every outdoor area saw a massive growth in footfall with adjacent bins requiring more frequent collections or collection after capacity was reached. Even when a bin was full, large deposits of waste continued to grow around the bins.

DLR staff, previously tasked with general bin collections now found that they were having to preform major clean-up operations at nearly every bin. The large footfall and the dynamic shift in consumption created a situation that saw collection levels rise to their highest recorded numbers. At the same time, DLR also had to address internal operational logistics required to facilitate social distancing and maintain separation between working sections. Staffing duties were re-structured across the entire Cleansing Section and additional personnel and vehicles were drafted into the bin service at the expense of other areas. Reactionary bin adjustments were sanctioned and bins from low usage sites were pulled into areas in crises. Weekday and weekend operations were increased significantly from their former levels in order to combat the increased demand.

The cleansing section took the lead, hosting weekly multi-departmental meetings with input from Cleansing, Parks, Environment, Events and Comms Office, to address the crises. A holistic approach was needed, and each council section offered specialist assistance in form of:

- Litter Enforcement engagement with businesses on their obligations for takeout sales.
- Hopper sensors were installed on priority/regularly distressed bins.
- An extra daily costal collection route was established and collected on a repeating loop.
- A suite of information stickers was created to promote better bin usage.
- Unique bin collection arrangements were agreed between different departments.
- High demand areas were reinforced with additional bins.
- Restrictors were removed.
- Additional collection shifts were made semi-permanent.
- Bin collections were heavily monitored with staffing adjusted as required.
- Regular monitoring and trend analysis of the Big Belly Clean application statistics to inform the dynamic changes to service demand

As can be seen in Figure 5b on page 9, a sudden jump in waste collection occurred in May of 2020. This jump coincided with lifting of the 2km limits on travel. From this point onwards, waste collections continued to rise and only peaked in October 2020. However, the situation is still presenting staff with record high daily bin collections. Staff reported some of most challenging periods occurring after times of fine weather as it is one of the external influences that affects people’s habits and consequently waste generation.

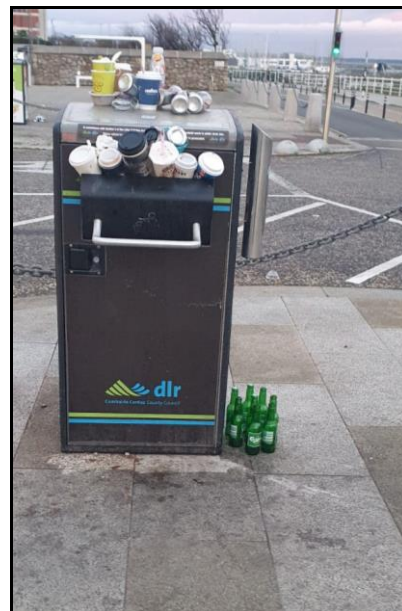


Figure 1: Typical Covid-19 conditions as found across the entire county during the lockdown.

Anti-Litter & Dog Fouling Campaigns

DLR are currently in the process of mobilising a campaign to combat littering and dog fouling related issues that have become prevalent across the county. This campaign is being delivered via a collaborative team across Environment, Cleansing, Parks and Comms office sections. We are aiming to mobilise this campaign urgently and in advance of the busy summer season and are involving external specialist expertise to strategize and facilitate the delivery of the campaign. One of the primary aims of the campaign is to encourage a culture shift in public attitudes towards litter and dog fouling and thereby instil personal responsibility on the public to look after their waste generated whilst in the public domain in a responsible manner.

Previous Smart Bin Review: March 2020

The outcomes of the March **2020** Street Bin review included:

1. A total of 149No. requests were received & considered, with 54No. requests being approved leading to the installation of bins at 14No. new locations.
2. 11No. Bins were removed from service due to excessive damage or vandalism.
3. Following the review, 9No. bins were relocated from areas of underuse or misuse to areas of higher demand.
4. 89No. requests were denied for various reasons.
5. Purchases were made of an additional 10No. bins in order to achieve our needs and also provide some stock.
6. 6No. bin requests were held active as requiring further consideration, one of which was later approved.

Street Bin Service

The Cleansing Section maintains the following street bins;

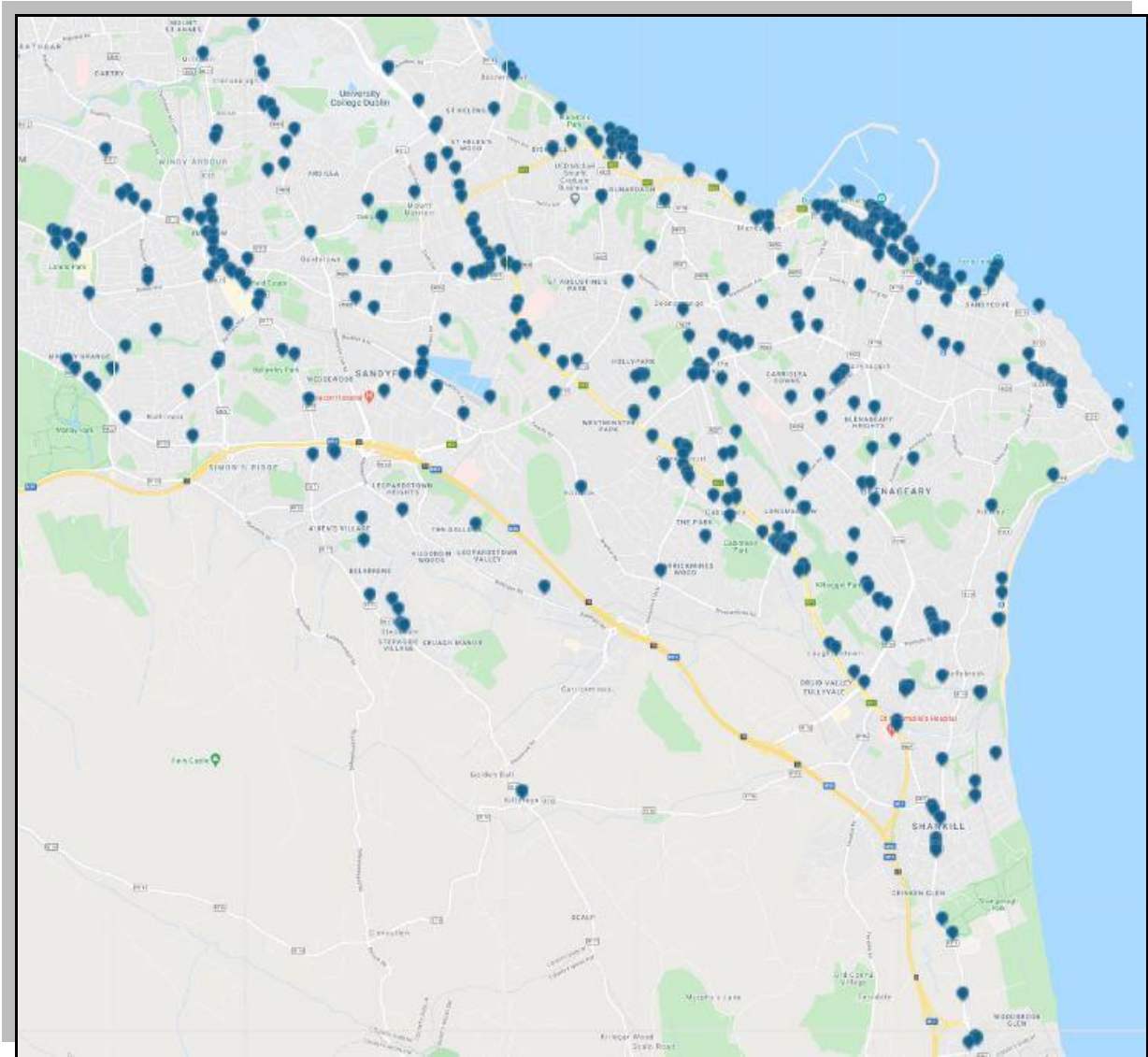


Figure 2: Locations of 371 Smart Bins on DLR Streets – March 2021.

- A stock of 373No. Smart Bins, as shown in Figure 2. This has been increased from a stock of 368No. in March 2020. The original figure in 2015 was 400No. bins.
- 22No. old style metal bins are located at beaches and areas where there's a risk of vandalism or in areas which are difficult to reach. This has increased from 12No. units in 2020.
- 12No. dog waste bins are in service along coastal locations where it is not feasible to place a Smart Bin.

- During the summer, extra bins are usually provided at bathing areas. However, these were placed into service in 2020 and have remained in-situ thus facilitating the Covid-19 emergency. Extra bins will again be installed if the need arises and the units are available.
- Standard metal bins, being specifically dedicated to recyclable waste remain operational at 3 main bathing areas. Currently the recycling waste collected is limited to ‘cans & plastic’ These were placed into seasonal service in 2020 but have remained in-situ thus facilitating the Covid-19 emergency.
- At present, 7No. recycling bins have been installed at specific locations within the county with a view to installing a further quantity in the coming weeks and months.
- 7No. bins have been removed from service because of damage, 5No. of which were burnt out and destroyed with the remaining two damaged via interactions between vehicles for which repairs are being sought.
- Funding for the allocation of additional bins has been secured and 2021 will see extensions to the service. The intention is to install an additional 40No. bins during 2021 whilst also increasing the efficiency of the bin collection service by utilising a new bin truck. All new bins are fitted with sensors which provide real-time feedback via a GSM telemetry system that monitors the waste levels within the bins. Alerts are triggered when a bin is near or at capacity thus increasing bin collection efficiency.

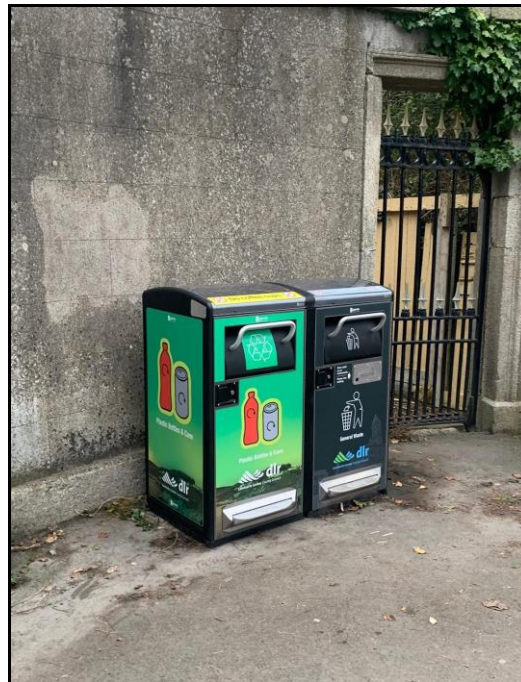


Figure 3b - Recycling bins at Cabinteely Park.

Recycling bins have been offered at 7No. sites around the county. Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council will assess the viability of the recycling collections gathered. This will be achieved with a prolonged examination of the contamination within the waste stream collected. It is intended to run this trial over a 6-month period and install circa 25No. recycling bins at appropriate locations, initially focusing on a broader rollout in the 7 strategic locations selected. This will be a dynamic trial where adjustments to recycling bin locations will be made throughout the programme in order to identify and avail of the most effective locations, thereby increasing the likelihood of a successful trial.

Under this trial, we have selected two distinct waste types, these include 'plastic bottles and cans' and further consideration will be given to other waste streams as the trial progresses. Careful consideration is needed regarding the appropriate waste streams as it should be noted that paper and other general forms of plastic are often too highly soiled to be considered as a viable waste stream.

Damaged Smart Bins

Seven smart bins were damaged in the period March 2020 to March 2021, these are listed in Table 2 below. Five of these bins were destroyed and have been taken out of service. Two bins damaged by vehicles will be repaired and relocated. All deliberately damaged bins were reported to the An Gardaí Síochana.

Collection Frequency January 2020 – December 2020

Collection and maintenance of street bins in Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown was traditionally carried out by two Cleansing Crews Monday to Sunday however, this has recently increased to as many as 4 crews on any particular day. The collection frequency shown below does not truly represent the full increase in effort as they only reflect the waste within and not contagious to the bin.

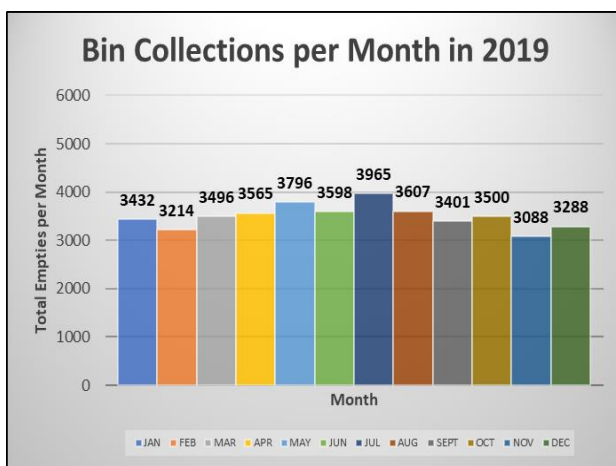


Figure 5a: Monthly Bin Collections 2019.

Monthly collection data from the 1st of January up until the 31st of December 2020 is presented below in Figure 5 and in Table 3.

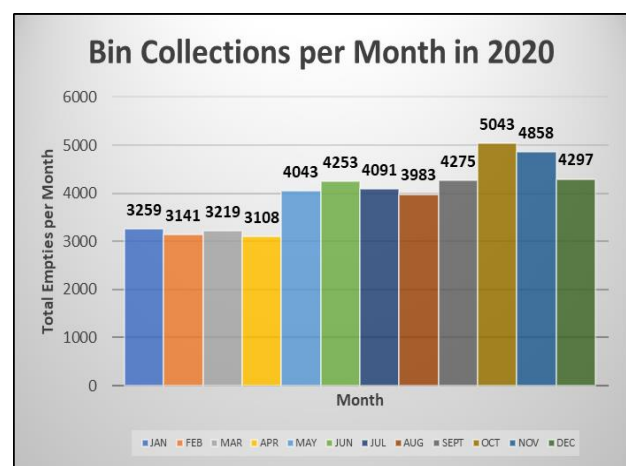


Figure 5b: Monthly Bin Collections 2020.

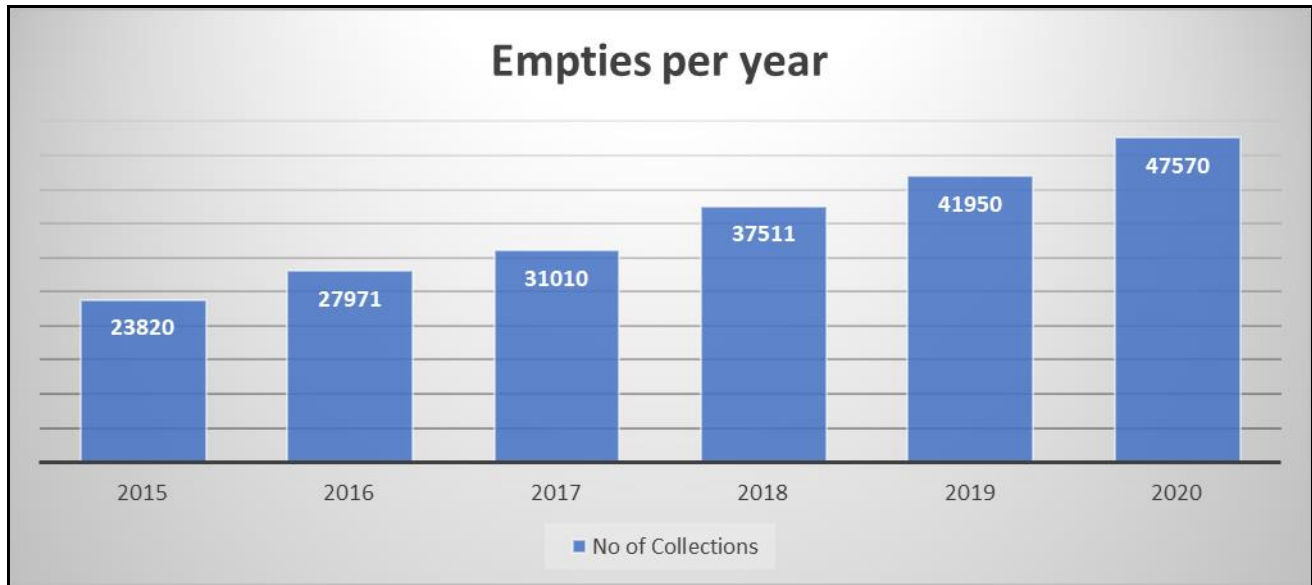


Figure 6: Bin Collections 2015- 2020.

It can be seen in Figure 5a that the waste-collections associated with street bins generally increases during the summer months as was the case in 2019. However, 2020 figures make an abrupt departure from normal trends in May when the 2km restrictions were lifted, please see Figure 5b. The normal seasonal summer peak is not visible, and the chart illustrates that collections did not actually peak until October. It can also be seen in Figure 6 that annual collections have risen year on year since the introduction of the Smart Bins in 2015. The 2019-20 collection growth rate shows a 13.4% increase as opposed to the preceding year's growth which forms a 10.6% increase. The service as a whole has seen a 99.7% increase in collections since its inception.

Individual Bin Efficiency

The ‘Clean Big Belly Bin’ online application gives access to information regarding each individual bin. Using this system, bins with abnormal collection frequency can be identified and examined. These bins then become the focus of attention and thereafter they are examined to ascertain why the collections frequencies are abnormal. In some instances, the extenuating factors causing the abnormal collection rates cannot be mitigated and actions such as removal or relocation may need to be considered.

The following images display the frequency of collections of each bin as an average number of days between collections.

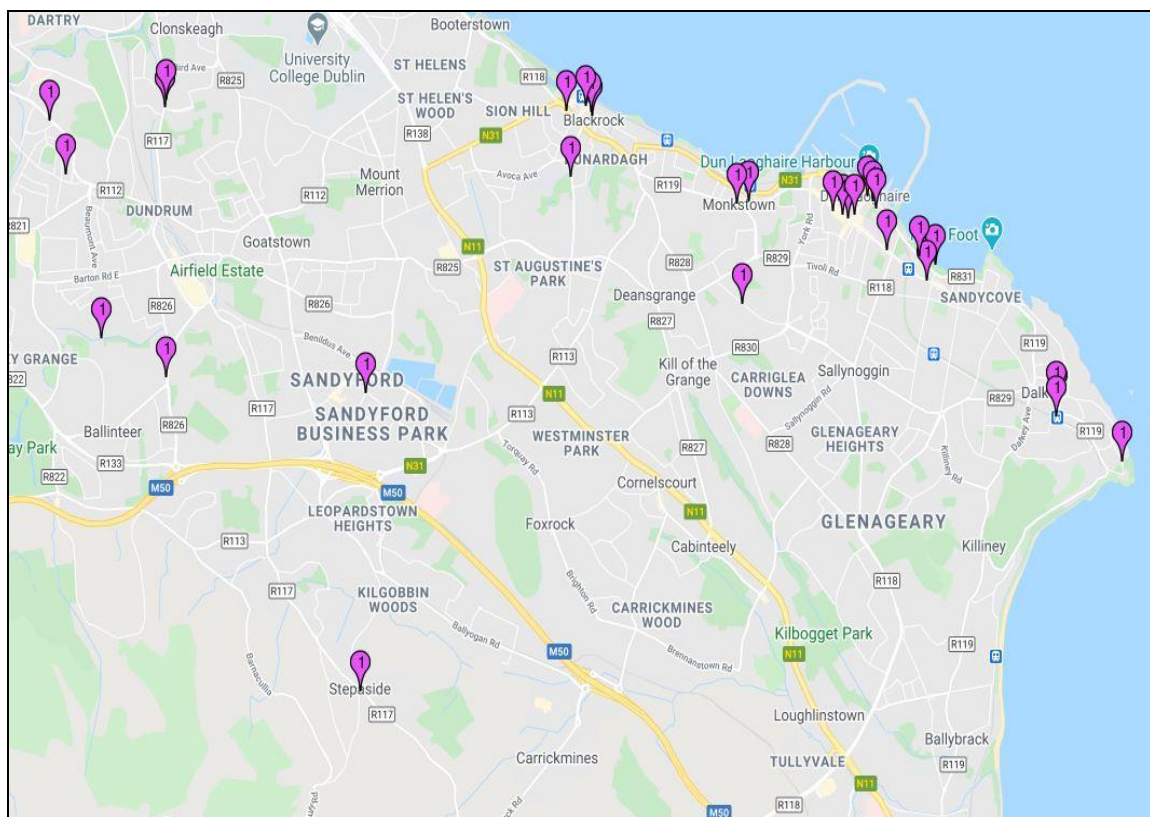


Figure 7: Bins Requiring Emptying Every Single Day.

Figure 7 shows the locations of bins requiring emptying every single day with 32No. bins collected every day in 2020. This has increased substantially from 18No. bins collected at this same frequency in the preceding year, 2019, thus forming a 78% increase. This large increase also occurred last year and was identified as a metric requiring further scrutinization. However, the emergence of Covid-19

and the subsequent upheaval has thus far thwarted any efforts at controlling this subset of units. Bins with a daily collection frequency of 1 day offer no logistical savings to the service and these units need to be examined to determine why they are filling so quickly and to ensure that the waste which they gather is legally generated street waste.

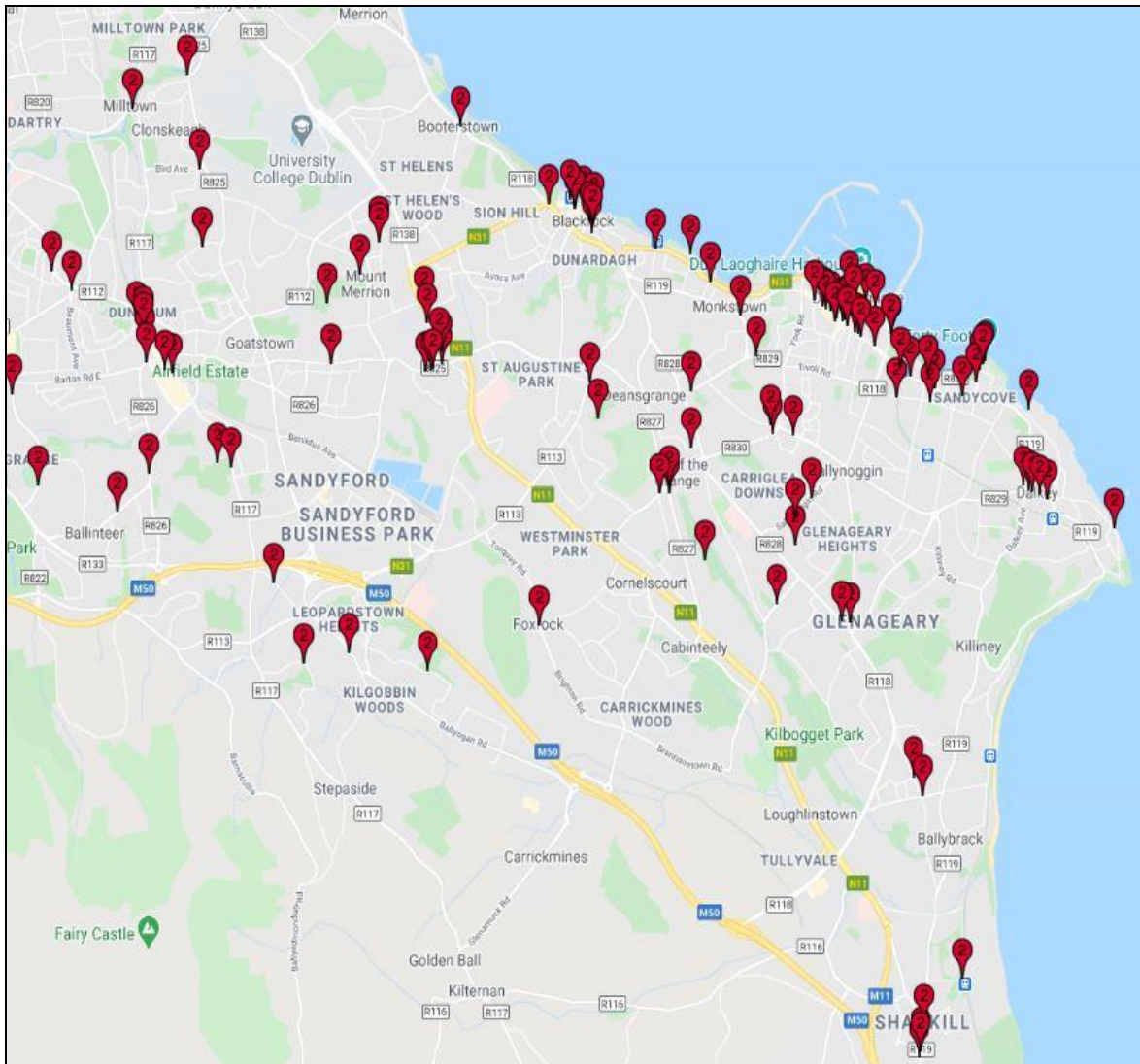


Figure 8: Bins Requiring Emptying Once Every Two Days.

Figure 8 shows locations of bins requiring emptying every two days. 117No. bins were collected every 2 days in 2020. This has also increased, up from 89No. bins collected at this frequency in the preceding year thus forming an almost 32% increase.

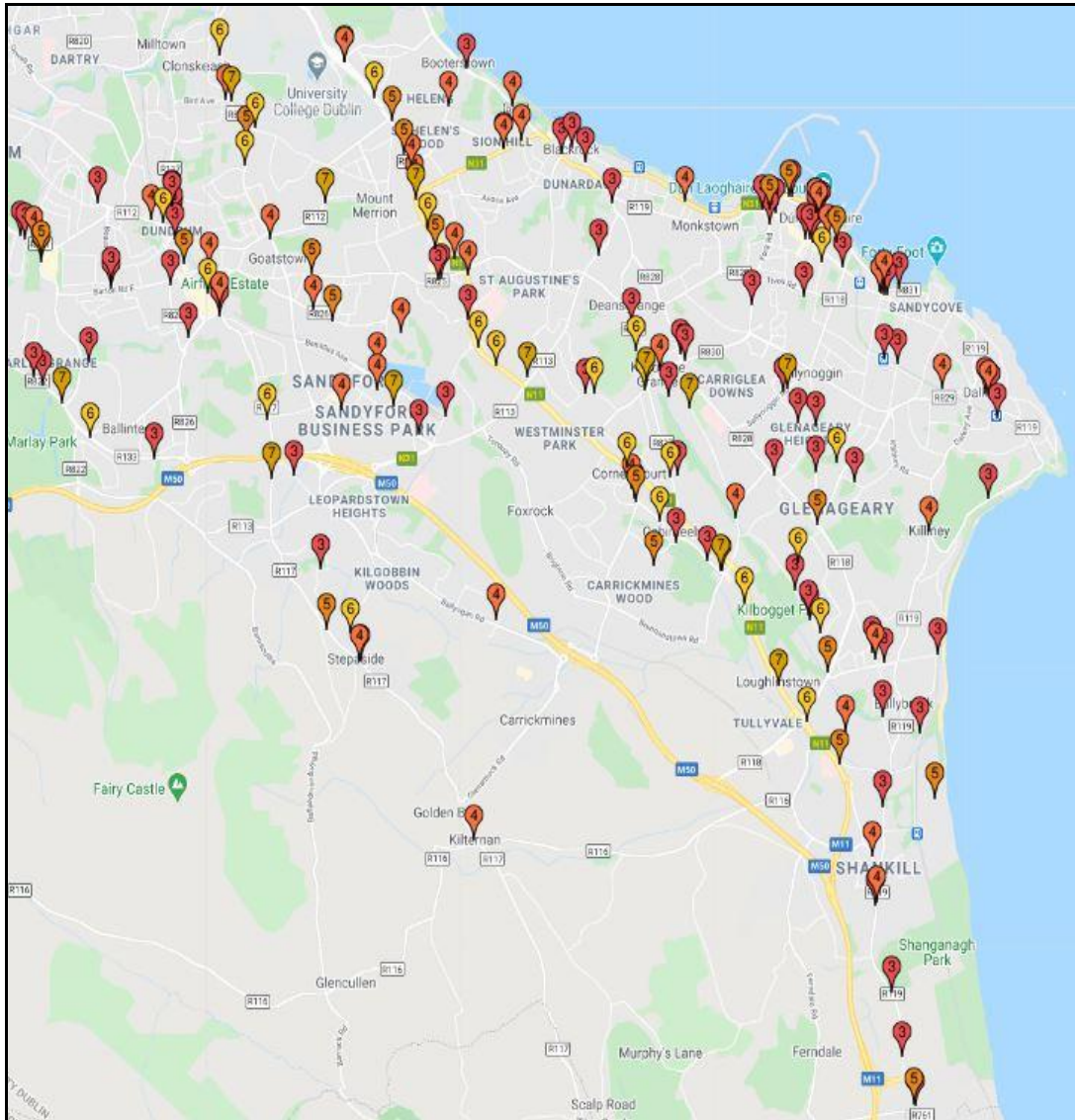


Figure 9: Bins Requiring Collection with a Frequency of Between 3 and 7 Days.

Figure 9 shows locations of bins requiring emptying every 3 to 7 days. Analysis of the data reveals that the number of bins requiring collection frequencies of between 3 & 7 days has increased considerably for 2020 with 183No. bins falling into this band, up from 117No. in the previous year, equating to a 55% increase.

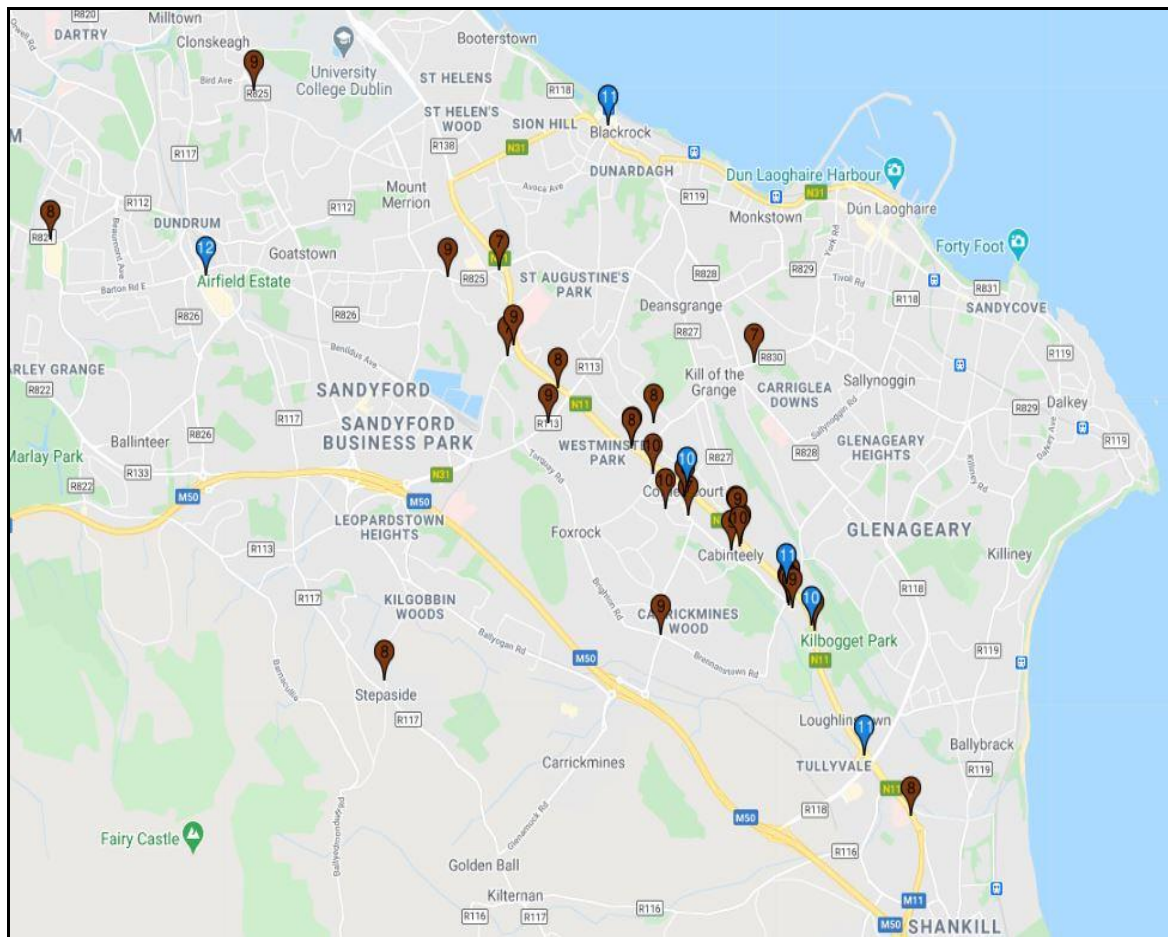


Figure 10: Bins Requiring Emptying Every 8 Days or More.

Figure 10 shows bins requiring collection every 8 days or more. This number has greatly decreased over the previous two years. This is due in part to better strategic placement of bins at areas of increased demand however, the reader should note that a reduction in this metric equates to units slipping into one of the other frequency bands above. As such, only 35No. units were collected ‘every 8 or more days’ in 2020 compared to 39No. units for the previous year and 59No. units in 2018.

Figures 7, 8, 9 & 10 highlight that the demand for emptying bins has remained in line with the public’s requirements. Covid-19 restrictions have played a major part in the frequency of bin collections at specific locations, i.e. where members of the public congregate on a regular basis. Bin collection frequencies are under constant review and DLRCC make any necessary adjustments to bin locations as needed.

Operational Issues

As in the previous reports, DLR operatives have continued to observe increases in the collection weights related to bin waste. It has been assessed that this is due mainly to domestic and/or commercial waste disposal being illegally deposited in street bins. This feeds into increases in population and economic activities in villages, towns and across the community.

On-going investigations into the disposal of domestic waste in street bins has shown that the level of domestic waste in street bins still accounts for approximately 50% of all waste disposed of. Measures have been taken to reduce the ingress of domestic waste and some successes have been observed but they are generally short lived.

Despite DLR's efforts, domestic waste disposal in public bins remains a major problem. Restrictors installed on specifically targeted bins have worked in some locations. However, the negative effect of using restrictors is that the bin is more likely to block up and cause increased littering within the area. The practice of applying notices on bins, informing the public of the legalities of dumping domestic waste in a public street bin, which started in 2018 has not had the desired effect. The most effective approach is to seek evidence from the offenders or their illegally disposed waste and to target them with fines, however this is not really cost effective.

Figure 12a shows the sinister side of illegal domestic waste dumping, i.e. a mattress and other domestic items left adjacent to the Smart Bin. This bin is regularly used as a focal point for illegal waste dumping. The excessive bulk of such illegal waste is a major nuisance to the efficiency of the service. Figure 12b shows stickers that promote the proper usage of Smart Bins by discouraging members of public from placing waste items on top of Smart Bins or blocking bin hoppers with large items such as pizza boxes.

Manual Handling Issues

Difficulties related to manual handling and excessive bin weights continue. It is well established that excessive weights in street bins are a direct consequence of the illegal disposal of both domestic and commercial waste.

The level of rubbish from the illegal disposal of domestic waste has increased the weights of bins to over 50kg per bin in some locations. Current collection-vehicle configurations consisting of tail-lifts (and sliding mesh-side access panels) are awkward to utilise. A new bin-collection vehicle, fitted with a stereo-typical mechanical aid, is currently being trialled. The aim of the trial is to improve the efficiency of emptying bins by providing a mechanical means for the operatives to dispose of heavy bins whilst also doing so in a faster and efficient manner. This bin truck trial was to be implemented

in 2020 but was delayed due to Covid-19 restrictions and the impact of a reduced workforce. The trial is running at present and the outcome of this trial will dictate the future choice of vehicles to which the council will commit.

Requests for New Bins

Requests are received regularly from members of the public, elected members and residential associations for the installation of additional bins. At the ‘street bin review’ any outstanding requests from the 2020 bin review are considered.

If initially approved, a request must still meet with the criteria for suitable installation sites (see appendix A), only then can the installation of a new Smart Bin in the most appropriate place be fully approved. Whilst every effort is made to ensure that the approved locations are suitable sites for the installation of a bin, there is always a possibility that site conditions will force departure from the planned installations.

150No. requests for new bins were received from the public and elected representatives from April 2020 up to the end of February 2021. A list of these requests is shown in Appendix C. All of these requests were considered as part of this review with 1No. still requiring further consideration by the Cleansing Department.

The Strategic Removal/Relocation of Inefficient Bins to Other Areas

Following the review, it has been proposed that because of Covid-19 that no bins shall be relocated due of to poor placement. Any further relocations will not be considered until the Covid-19 crisis has ended. Within reason, any bins which were moved from one area to another to address the crisis will be relocated to their original location as they, or replacements become available.

In spite of this sentiment, it remains incumbent on this report to highlight large increases in the number of bin collections which are attributed to the 1 & 2 day collection frequencies data set, as highlighted by Figures 7 & 8. Bins which require daily collections or collection ever second day will be closely examined to determine if action can be taken to help reduce the waste generation at these locations. It is expected that several additional bin adjustments will be undertaken once Covid-19 eases.

Proposed Installation of New Smart Bins in Response to Requests

The 2020 review period saw similar numbers of requests compared to the previous year's period. 150No. requests were logged over the period from April 2020 up to end of February 2021. Every request received an initial response stating that the outcome of their request would only be made known upon publication of the bin review. Non-specific requests i.e. 'multiple bins over large areas' can't be fully detailed in this report. If one location, in a non-specific request is granted then the outcome as measured against the full request is deemed as a single approval. Requesting bodies and their agents should strive to make each request as specific as possible.

Following extensive research and consideration of each request, 77No. requests were granted out of the 150No. requests. One additional request recorded last year as requiring 'further consideration' was also approved during the review period thus bringing the total number of requests approved to 78No.

New bin installations must take account of criteria shown in appendix A. New installations or replacements need to be considered against the number of bins available for relocation, the purchase cost of additional bins, and the need to prioritise new bins for deployment in the urban streetscape. Following our review, it is proposed to place 40No. new Smart Bins in the locations listed below in Table 4. These 40No. installations will satisfy the 78 approved requests.

There is currently only 1No. request which is being held open as it requires further considerations. See appendix G.

Summary of the March 2021 DLR Street Bin Review

1. 150No. requests for additional bins were received since the last review. See Appendix C.
2. 7No. bins were removed from service since the last review due to excessive damage or vandalism. It is proposed to replace some of these bins. See Appendix H for a list of damaged units.
3. In order to implement the required installations as per this report, it is proposed to purchase 40No. new bins within the county as listed in Table 4.
4. 7No. recycling bins have been installed on a trialled basis throughout the county with the intention of installing an additional quantity during the current trial period.
5. Of the 150No. new requests for bin installation received, 78No. requests have been approved leading to the installation of bins at 42No. new locations (2No. of which relate to recycling bins), one request remains under consideration and 72No. requests out of the 150No. new requests have been denied. See appendix E and appendix F.
6. Following on from 2020's requests that were held under consideration, 1No. installation was approved and the remaining 5No. were denied.
7. Cleansing will continue to monitor bin performance and remain reactive to the dynamic changes that Covid-19 may generate throughout 2021.

Requests for New Bins / Amendments

Members of the public or elected members can submit requests in relation to street bins. Requests can range from the removal of street bins to the installation of new bins. All requests should be concise and specific being logged through the councils Civic Hub email address: info@dlrcoco.ie These requests will be considered as part of a next annual bin review.

Appendix A: Criteria for the Placement of Street Bins

The Cleansing Section receives requests for new bins regularly. These requests are considered at each street bin review with consideration given to the following factors:

- Whether some bins are under-used and could be more efficiently placed.
- Whether additional bins are required in areas considered to be litter black spots.
- Accessibility and mobility considerations, such as footpath width.
- Safe system of work - whether there is a safe place for council vehicle to pull in to safely empty the bin.
- Locations close to schools, shops and shopping areas are generally prioritised.
- The risk of vandalism at certain locations.
- Whether there is a high risk of disposal of domestic waste in particular locations such as in residential area.

It is generally found that a large proportion of requests for new bins are proposed in locations within or around housing estates, areas where there is a high risk of vandalism or in locations where it is not safe from a traffic management perspective regarding maintenance of bins.

The cost of providing and maintaining each street bin is approximately €1,600 per annum. It is important to ensure that street bins are optimally situated around the county.

Appendix B: Bin Service in Parks

Across the county, departmental-jurisdictions dictate that specific areas of control fall under the remit of different individual sections. As such, the cleansing-section are responsible for the provision and maintenance of bins within all public areas, other than parks, with some minor exceptions. Both Cleansing and Parks have strict criteria which are used to assess the suitability of individual bin placements.

These criteria form constraints that affect each section differently, in some instances they can prohibit a specific section from considering the placement of a bin at a particular site. However, it is often beneficial to strategically position a bin just outside of an area that is unsuitable within one departmental-jurisdiction yet acceptable in the adjacent jurisdiction e.g. a bin placement can often be acceptable outside of an unmanned park yet unaccepted within the same park.

It is clearly identifiable that cleansing deliberately maintain a large portion of their current bin stock at locations that are placed near to parks and park entrances. Such bin-placements are only considered viable if they satisfy cleansing's strict installation-criteria. The cleansing section maintain smart bins within the streetscape along with some 22 metal coastal bins and several dog waste bins.

Bins are generally only provided within parks which maintain a complement of staff. Bins within Marlay Park, Cabinteely Park and other flagship parks throughout the county are maintained by the Parks Department staff. Reports in relation to these bins within parks should be addressed to the Parks Department.

NOTE * Unfortunately, the Park's Department do not provide bins in local-amenity neighbourhood parks. These neighbourhood parks are typically frequented by local residents and it is not unreasonable to expect, that upon leaving the Park one would remove their rubbish or pick up after their dogs and dispose of such material in a responsible manner.
