

#### How to use this document:

This document is intended to provide an overview or "Roadmap" for the Dun Laoghaire local support group (ULG), setting out the steps to be taken in the process of producing an Integrated Action Plan within Tourism-Friendly Cities Project.

It must be noted that we are operating in a time when the Covid pandemic severely impacts on our ability to plan definitively and as such this Roadmap must be seen as a "living document" and may need to change or adapt to local circumstances.

This document also includes the planned Transnational Network meetings with our partner cities.

To assist the reader we have provided a glossary of terms to explain some of the URBACT terminology.

#### **Glossary of Terms**

**URBACT**: it is the European Territorial Cooperation programme aiming to foster sustainable integrated urban development in cities across Europe. It is an instrument of the Cohesion Policy, co-financed by the European Regional Development Fund, the 28 Member States, Norway & Switzerland.

**URBACT Local Group (ULG)**: since URBACT follows a participatory approach, it is the team who brings together all relevant stakeholders having a stake in the policy challenge addressed by the city

**Action Planning Network (APN)**: it is an exchange and learning tool for cities that have common challenges to be addressed in a transnational learning environment with peers and experts plus working with local stakeholders to agree an Integrated Action Plan focusing on implementing the policy challenge locally.

**Lead Expert (LE)**: his or her role is to support beneficiaries in designing and implementing transnational learning activities, to foster the local level uptake of the learning developed in transnational activities, and more generally to help deliver expected results.

**Lead partner (LP):** it is the city who manages the URBACT cities network connecting it with the URBACT Secretariat.

**Integrated Action Plan: (IAP)**: is a succinct document defining actions to be implemented, covering the planned timings, implementation responsibilities, costings, funding sources, monitoring indicators and risk assessment of the actions.

**Small Scale Actions (SSA)**: pilot actions to be undertaken in order to experiment with new ideas for projects gained from other network exchanges and in line with the cities' network topic.





**Introduction to Tourism-friendly Cities Action Planning Network** 

TOURISM-FRIENDLY CITIES is an URBACT
Action Planning Network aimed at exploring
how tourism can be made sustainable in
medium-sized cities, reducing the negative
impact on neighborhoods and areas interested
by different types of tourism and its related
aspects through integrated and inclusive
strategies keeping a balance between the
needs of the local community, in terms of
quality of life and of services available, and the
promotion of sustainable urban development at
environmental, social and economic level.

Dun Laoghaire Rathdown is one of 9 European Cities chosen as part of the TFC network. The network is led by the City of Genoa, Italy.

TFC won a competitive process, and is now one of a few selected networks selected at European level to conduct such work. Here you can find more info:

### INTRODUCTION TO DUN LAOGHAIRE


Dún Laoghaire Rathdown is one of four Local Authorities that make up the Dublin region. Dun Laoghaire is a suburban coastal town in County Dublin, about 12 km south of Dublin city centre. The population of Dun Laoghaire Rathdown is 218,000.

"The outdoors is truly accessible here". Travel just a few kilometres from Dublin's City Centre and you'll find yourself in a peaceful area that combines miles of wave lapped coastline with rugged mountain terrain.

Maritime activities are a plenty on and in the sparkling waters of Dublin Bay a UNESCO Biosphere, while land lovers will find plenty to enjoy among the slopes and valleys of the Dublin Mountains.

Dun Laoghaire, with its miles of pristine coastline, it's no surprise that the sea features large here. There's an aquatic abundance of options for messing about in boats – sea kayaking for the adventurous, along with sailboat trips for a more leisurely maritime experience.

Cyclists can gear up for gentle seafront bike rides or attempt more challenging off-road trails, while the inviting hills and woodlands provide a lush playground for hikers and cyclists.

## The focus of our Dun Laoghaire-Rathdown Roadmap

Dun Laoghaire is aware of its touristic potential, but is also aware of the opportunities and challenges that its close proximity to Dublin poses. Most of DLR visitors are Dublin tourists that choose DLR for a day experience. There are easy connections by trains and buses to/from Dublin. Due to limited accommodation capacity, it is unlikely that the profile of day visitors will change anytime soon to overnight guests.

The Dún Laoghaire Harbour is one of the biggest visitor attractions in our county. DLR is now focusing on how to maximise the use of this facility in the most sustainable way and consider the impact this will have for local communities.




Accessible and Sustainable tourism are important concepts that we need to learn more about. How we engage with local Businesses and Communities will be key to the success of this project.




