


Ulysses 101

DLR LEXICON EXHIBITION PROGRAMME

The Sea - David Branigan

During the Pandemic, local photographer David Branigan received an Arts Council grant to produce a book of his work. The book features 21 images in black & white. The theme is how we use our connections with the sea to find our resilience, especially in times of crisis. It was intended that the work would be photographed around Ireland, but regional lockdowns prevented that.

The result is that most of the images were taken around Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown and are both landbased and afloat. These beautiful images have been made into this breathtaking, unmissable exhibition.



Dún Laoghaire Baths 1843-2023

Marking the re-opening of the Dún Laoghaire Baths area and celebrating the 180th anniversary of their original opening, this exhibition is a pictorial celebration of life, work and play in the Baths. From their



origins as a private enterprise, through the Edwardian redevelopment by the Urban District Council and covering heydays and dereliction through to the present day. It charts the highs and lows of this much-loved local institution – swimming lessons, sunbathing paradise, childhood freedom, protests, ice creams and fun park. Told through the images and the voices of those who lived, worked and played in the Dún Laoghaire Baths over many years, the exhibition brings the past to life, while looking to the next chapter in the life of this iconic Dún Laoghaire attraction.

An Garda Síochána Centenary Exhibition

dlr Library users can easily access this new service with their library card, and all for free! Just search Kanopy on our website libraries.dlroco.ie and follow the instructions to create your account.


