



The **Dublin Mountains Partnership** or DMP was set up in May 2008 with the aim of improving the recreational experience for people using the Dublin Mountains, whilst recognising the objectives and constraints of the various landowners. While the long term strategy is to manage recreation in the Dublin Mountains on a more sustainable basis, the DMP's Action Plan is already underway. Work has commenced on a range of other initiatives including the provision of new and upgraded trails, improved signage and the preparation of a custom DMP map.

Mountain Meitheal Ireland, founded in 2002 offers the opportunity to give something back by volunteering to work on trails which protect our fragile environment. To date the group has built 14km of trails in upland areas, built and repaired bridges; they have constructed three emergency shelters on the Wicklow Way, one on the Bangor Trail and one on the Western Way in County Mayo. They also run training courses.
