The Ballyogan Regional Temporary Rest Centre opened its doors to Ukrainian nationals on 28 April.

Significant work has been undertaken by regional agencies, led by Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council, to provide temporary accommodation facilities, managed by a dedicated site supervisor overseeing an extensive facilities team, as well as catering, security and cleaning details, all operating on a 24 hour basis.

The Ballyogan Regional Temporary Rest Centre can accommodate up to 300 displaced Ukrainian Nationals for short periods. Thereafter they will be allocated longer term accommodation in other areas of the state.

As part of a comprehensive wrap around service, accommodation services at the Centre are being supported by HSE staff including Environmental Health, Public Health and COVID-19 services. The HSE is providing onsite support to meet the healthcare needs of Ukrainian residents, and residents also have access to an offsite GP service 7 days a week.

Among the facilities available in the temporary rest centre is separate laundry and sanitary facilities, internet access, television spaces, games consoles, games room, chessboards, use of bikes and scooters, libraries of Ukrainian books for children and adults, translation services, as well as online access to Ukrainian newspapers and magazines.

Additionally, orientation and information sessions, basic English language lessons and an arts and music entertainment programme is being developed both onsite and nearby offsite.

Local coordination efforts to develop as safe and as comprehensive support services as possible include Southside Partnership, HSE, An Garda Siochána, Department of Social Protection, dlr Education and Training Board, TUSLA, Community and Family Resource Centres, dlr Volunteers Centre, colleagues in the East Region and a number of other community and voluntary groups.

Bus Connects

The Preliminary Business Case for the overall BusConnects Dublin Programme has been given approval from the Government. The Core Bus Corridors Schemes' statutory applications are now being progressed by the NTA for formal submission to An Bord Pleanala. The Clongriffin to City Centre Core Bus Corridor Scheme was submitted to An Bord Pleanala in early April 2022 and details available at: <u>https://clongriffinscheme.ie</u> The Blackrock to City Centre Core Bus Corridor Scheme (CBC 15) was the second formal application to ABP and the 8 week statutory public consultation period for this development is now underway running from Tuesday May 17th to Tuesday July 12th 2022. All planning documentation is available at: <u>https://belfieldblackrockscheme.ie/</u>



The Bray to City Centre CBC planning application will be included in a later tranche of applications to be submitted to ABP and the submission of this planning application is now anticipated towards the end of this year (2022).

The submission of the planning applications to ABP triggers a formal statutory public consultation process in respect of each of the stand-alone Core Bus Corridor schemes, with submissions to be made directly to An Bord Pleanála for their consideration. During this process, the finalised Environmental Impact Assessment Reports, inclusive of traffic impact analyses, will be published and available for inspection (including online) and purchase. The public will then have the formal opportunity to have their views heard and considered by An Bord Pleanála as part of the statutory consultation process to inform An Bord Pleanála's assessment of each of the stand-alone Core Bus Corridor schemes.

Dundrum ABTA - Area Based Transport Assessment

Work on this project is progressing and the ABTAs Stages 1 & 2 are now largely completed with work now underway on Stage 3 – Options Assessment & Development

Bus Interchanges at Dundrum & Dun Laoghaire

Discussions are ongoing with the NTA on these projects which aims to address the need for improvements to bus interchange facilities to cater for the planned service increases under the BusConnects New Dublin Area Bus Network. Meetings/workshops are ongoing to progress this work and a multi-disciplinary group from the Council is in place to assist.

Old Conna ABTA - Area Based Transport Assessment

The Council is engaging with the NTA on this study and the specific requirements to be taken into account in assessing the transport & mobility needs of the southeast of the county.

New Bus Stops to Serve Planned BusConnects Orbital Bus Services

The Traffic Section has been liaising with the NTA on the location and design of new bus stops throughout the county, required to support planned new bus services being introduced by the NTA over the next two years. It is anticipated that bus stop approval notices for the new stops will be issued to the NTA in Q3 of this year.

3. Water & Drainage

Drainage and Flood Alleviation

Engineering and Environmental Consultants were appointed in December 2019 for Flood Risk Management works on the **Deansgrange Stream**. This is a 4-to-5-year project. Activities completed to date include additional survey work, CCTV surveys, a Constraints study, Hydrological analysis, and hydraulic modelling. Initial Public Consultation is now complete. Optioneering, environmental surveys and engagement with key stakeholders are underway. A Ground Investigation contract is complete, and the report is awaited. Work has begun to review possible sites for environmental impacts. We are in consultation with Irish Rail.

Engineering and Environmental Consultants have also been appointed for Flood Risk Management Works on the **Carrickmines/Shanganagh Rivers**. This is a 5+ year project. Data gathering is underway. A Flow/Rainfall Survey is complete. Further topographical survey work is being done this month. Early damage/benefits assessments are underway to ensure a cost-beneficial scheme is achievable. An initial public engagement is complete following short briefing sessions with Area Councillors. The Hydrology/Hydraulic report is now complete and initial options are being developed. A Ground Investigation Contract has gone out for tender.



Drainage Section is working closely with the OPW as they commence the update process of the published flood maps as required by the EU Floods Directive. Hydraulic modelling of the Dundrum Slang Stream is complete. Flood maps have been completed and will be uploaded shortly by the OPW to their website.

The Monkstown environs flood risk mapping project is underway. The topographical survey is now largely completed. A flow/rainfall survey and CCTV survey has commenced.

4. Roads Control Unit

Irish Water Reinstatement IWR Works 2022

Roads Control Unit is continuing to carry out the permanent reinstatement works throughout the administration area of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council (DLRCC) according to the current service level agreement (SLA) between Irish Water and DLRCC. In 2022, 307 no. locations are received and 192 no. were fully reinstated.

Cleansing, Beaches & Coastal Protection Updates – May 2022

- Workforce have continued operating on staggered roster arrangements to maintain social distancing requirements.
- Coliemore Harbour: A planning application has been submitted to An Bord Pleanála under Section 177AE.
- 40 Foot Tenders were returned for the remedial repair works. However it may be July/August before the works start due to long lead times.
- Weeding tender was returned via eTenders. Redlough Landscaping will be our weeding contractor for 2022 and will be starting by the end of May.
- 1100L bin collection tenders were returned via eTenders. Panda will be collecting the 1100L bins and some bins will be in place by the end of May with a view to extending the service during the summer period.
- Lifeguards: A second advert was released in order to obtain more applications. All
 interviews are now complete with 23 applicants interviewed in total. A swim test is
 scheduled for the 21st of May. Garda vetting and medicals need to be completed for
 all successful applicants.
- Public Participation in the Identification of Bathing Waters was uploaded onto the dlr website on the 9th of May.
- Meeting was held with the HSE regarding the Bathing Water Incident Management Plan.
- A Councillor Briefing will be held in late May to update the Councillors on our Coastal Defence Strategy.
- A deep clean schedule for our Towns and Villages has been prepared. Ballybrack is scheduled for Thursday 19th May.
- A tender is being prepared for power washing our Towns and Villages

7. Dún Laoghaire Harbour

Cruise Ship Business

We have approximately 70 Cruise Ships booked into the Harbour in 2022. The first ship arrived on 29th March and was a very successful visit. Approximately 15 ships have visited since then, and the Harbour is being well received by ship management, cruise guests and the crew who come ashore. Some additional landside infrastructure is currently being installed to complete the area.

Projects:

National Watersports Campus

DLRCC in partnership with Irish Sailing and the Irish Underwater Council have been approved in principle for Stream 1 grant funding for the development of a National Watersports Campus. We have responded to requests for additional information and are now finalising the grant process and agreements with the project partners.

An MOU has been signed with Irish Sailing and Diving Ireland in order to set out and agree the objectives of the project.

Berth 2 Fenders (Carlisle Pier)

A project to replace the Berth 2 fenders has been given approval to proceed to procurement stage. RPS Group have been appointed to carry out the design and procurement for this project. This project was tendered, and Sorensen Construction have been appointed to deliver the project. We are awaiting Foreshore consent to proceed to works on site.

Grant funding has recently been secured for the installation phase of this project from the recent Brexit Local Authority Marine Infrastructure Scheme.

Berth 3 Fenders (Carlisle Pier)

Grant funding has recently been secured for a project to replace the Berth 3 fenders from the recent Brexit Local Authority Marine Infrastructure Scheme. The project has been given approval to proceed to procurement stage. RPS Group have been appointed to carry out the design and procurement for this project as it is a mirror image of the Berth 2 fender project.

East Pier Revetment Repairs

Grant funding has recently been secured for a project to repair the sloping revetment at the back (east side) of the East Pier from the recent Brexit Local Authority Marine Infrastructure Scheme. This revertant provides the primary protection for the East Pier and has suffered some damage over recent years from the larger storms. A tender has been issued for a Marine Engineering Consultancy firm to design and manage the project which is likely to be on site during the summer of 2023.

Ferry Terminal

Planning permission was granted for the ferry terminal project on 7th February 2020. A planning appeal was lodged to An Bord Pleanála. An Bord Pleanála have now granted permission for the development.

A business briefing on the ferry terminal proposal was delivered to the elected members by Hilary Haydon on 25th February 2020. An agreement to lease the building (subject to Foreshore and Section 183 consent) was signed in December 2021, and the Foreshore Lease has been agreed with the Dept.



This matter will be brought to the full Council in the coming weeks for disposal pursuant to Section 183 of the Local Government Act 2001.

Dublin Array Windfarm

The developers of the Dublin Array Windfarm have approached the Harbour about the possibility of establishing an Operations and Maintenance Base for the windfarm. It is hoped that there might be synergies with the ferry Terminal project. Early engagement is ongoing with the developer's team to establish the exact requirements.

Energy

As part of the Energy Team's on-going efforts to improve dlr's energy performance, a staff energy awareness presentation was delivered online. The presentation included a brief outline of the evolving policy context and public sector targets, along with highlights of key actions undertaken that contributed to dlr winning the SEAI's Energy Team of the Year award in 2021. Additionally, the presentation shared energy saving tips and useful resources to encourage staff to save energy in the workplace and at home.

A Staff Travel and 'My Mobility Hub' Report was compiled following a survey conducted on Citizen Space in March. The report shared the views of over 300 respondents and gave an indication of current commuting and work travel patterns. The report highlighted the share of various transport modes currently adopted by staff and is available on the dlr Intranet. While the report only captured staff responses, the new work travel reporting obligations which motivated the survey, also include elected representatives work travel. Under these obligations, the distance and mode of transport for all staff and elected representatives work travel must be reported in aggregated form on an annual basis to the Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland (SEAI).

Comhairle Contae County Council Community and Cultural Development

Community Response Forum

The Community response to the crisis in Ukraine and the influx of Ukrainian nationals into the county, is being led and coordinated by Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council in collaboration with a wide range of stakeholders in the Community Response Forum, supported by a wide range of community and volunteer groups.

The Community Response Forum held its first meeting on 28 March and has met weekly through April and May. Support services are being provided to those Ukrainian nationals who are being accommodated both in hotels and in private accommodation within the County. The Ballyogan Rest Centre opened at the end of April with an initial capacity of 180 which has now increased to 300. This is a regional facility for the temporary accommodation of displaced Ukrainians on arrival into the country before being assigned to move on accommodation throughout the country.

Temporary donations drop off points were established in Community Facilities, County Hall and Dundrum offices.

Ballyogan Parish Hall has been established as a Ukrainian Community Hub to provide information sessions, English Classes and other activities for Ukrainian Nationals.

Joint Policing Committee and Local Policing Fora

A meeting of the Central Dún Laoghaire Local Policing Forum took place on the 3rd May and a meeting of the Ballybrack/Loughlinstown/Shankill Local Policing Forum took place on the 4th May 2022. A Joint Policing Committee (JPC) Meeting took place on the 24th May. This was followed by the annual public JPC Meeting. Both meetings took place in the Talbot Hotel Stillorgan.

Operation Irene 2022 was launched in County Hall on Tuesday 31st May 2022.

This is a targeted multi-agency operation to combat underage alcohol consumption and consumption of alcohol in public places throughout the Dublin Metropolitan Region and specifically in the Dún Laoghaire area, through the enforcement of legislation regulating the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol as well as relevant public order legislation.

LCDC

An LCDC meeting took place on the 11^{th} May. At this meeting the LCDC approved Operating costs grants under the Community Activities Fund to a total of \notin 99,819.65. Recommended applications for the Capital costs element of the grant scheme will be brought to the LCDC meeting in June for approval.

Community Facilities Network

The Community Facilities Network held their 2nd in-person meeting on 10th May in Sandyford Community Centre. This meeting provided other Facility Staff and Board members an opportunity to see another Facility and learn how they operate. Discussions focused on the use of social media to increase footfall in Facilities.

Pride of Place

The IPB Pride of Place Awards took place in the Gleneagles Hotel Killarney on 16th May. Two Community Groups were nominated by dlrcc. Holly House/LBS Mens Shed were nominated under the category Community Resilience and Rosemount Family Resource Centre were nominated under the category Community Wellbeing Initiatives. Holly House/LBS Mens Shed were awarded runner up in the Community Resilience category.

Love Our Laneways

A public workshop was held on 18^{th} May in Sallynoggin Community & Senior Centre. In $26 \mid P \mid ag \mid e$



attendance were dlr staff representatives from Community, Traffic, Parks and Lighting. Workshops were also held with Children and Young People attending the local Primary School and with the Sallynoggin Senior Citizens Group. Residents are hoping to reestablish the Sallynoggin Neighbourhood Watch group with support from Community Staff and the local Community Policing Unit of An Garda Síochána.

Consultations with Children and Young People

The Community Development team are supporting Parks Department with organising and facilitating consultations with children and young people across the county so their feedback can be used to inform the dlr Play Policy. The second of these consultations took place with young people attending Holly House Youth Group in Loughlinstown.

dlr Comhairle na nÓg

Community Staff attended and promoted dlr Comhairle na nÓg at Eurofound Ireland on 9th May to celebrate Europe Day and the European Year of Youth.

One of the members of dlr Comhairle na nÓg presented to the Joint Oireachtas Committee on European Affairs on 11th May. The presentation was on policy issues which affect young people.

Period Poverty

Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council have been awarded Grant Funding from the Department of Health for the provision of free period products to support the implementation of period poverty mitigation measures. The products will be placed in public toilets in identified DLR Libraries, Community Facilities, Community/Voluntary Sector Service Providers, in County Hall and the Dundrum Office.

Estate Management

All 12 Estate Management Forum have submitted their annual Service Plans for 2022. Funding has been released for works included in Service Plan 1. The cross departmental working group continue to support progress of actions identified in Service Plans across all 12 areas.

Age-Friendly Programme & Social Inclusion:

As part of Bealtaine 2022, a Dementia Awareness Day took place on 10th May to inform the public of the various social and cultural supports available to people with Dementia and their families, carers and friends in dlr.

A number of Africa Day events took place from 24th to 30th May, with funding allocated from the Department of Foreign Affairs. These events included a film screening, a soccer tournament, cooking videos, a discussion panel and a celebration of African music on Dublin South FM.

A ceremony took place on 31 May to recognise Ronnie Delany's appointment as the Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council Age Friendly Ambassador.

Arts

Municipal Gallery Programme

Home Place: An exhibition of new work by Gerry Blake continued.

Home, in the form of a dwelling, is a place of belonging and attachment. Making a home, however, is more difficult now than at any time in recent memory. Photographic artist Gerry Blake has spent the last 3 years exploring abandoned houses around Ireland. On these journeys, he also met with people who are living in various forms of accommodation, from cottages and apartments to house boats and converted buses.



The exhibition was supported by events including a Gallery Walk and Talk with the Artist and Poet in Residence Jessica Traynor and an online In Conversation Event with the Artist and writer Darren Campion.

May Music Day

Presented by dlr in association with Music Network, the May Music day was held on the 21st May in dlr Lexicon. Funded by the Local Live Performance Scheme supported by the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media the day featured 7 free concerts by previous musicians in residence and was attended by almost 500 people. The annual Musicians in Residence scheme is funded by The Arts Council.

Dementia Inclusive Programme

dlr Arts Office took part in a Dementia Awareness Day on 10th May in dlr LexIcon, Dún Laoghaire. This was organised to celebrate Bealtaine, and the Alzheimer Society of Ireland (ASI) National Tea Day, and was an opportunity to inform the public and raise awareness about the various social and cultural supports that are available to people with Dementia and their families, carers and friends in Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown. Taster sessions of the Dementia Inclusive Gallery Tours took place, alongside demonstrations of the various Dementia inclusive library supports and Sports Partnership resources. Local support organisations were also on site with information and representatives available to chat to people.

This is part of a broader Dementia Inclusive Programme by the Arts Office. A Dementia Inclusive Exhibition will open in the Municipal Gallery, dlr LexIcon in mid-June. A key element of this will be a multi-sensory commission in Gallery 2 concentrating on the experience of touch, smell, sound and visuals, funded by Creative Ireland.

Musicians in Residence Programme 2022

Cellist Lioba Petrie commenced her Residency in dlr LexIcon. She is working with Abigail Smith, a Dublin based musician and composer, in May and June. Collaboratively they will develop music which is the bringing together of ideas, seeds of musical thought and takes inspiration from the surrounding areas and their lives as Mothers and musicians living in County Dublin. An informal concert will take place in the Studio, dlr LexIcon on Sunday 19th June to showcase some of their new work.

The dlr Musicians in Residence Programme is funded by the Arts Council, and managed by Music Network.

Small wonders

Cruinniú na nÓg is the National Day for Creativity and Culture for Children and Young People. dlr Arts Office in partnership with dlr CYPSC (Children and Young Person Services Committee) is delighted to announce 'Small Wonders', a new multi-sensory creative experience for 0–3-year Olds and their caregivers has been awarded the Commission opportunity funded by Creative Ireland. Artists Niamh Lawlor, George Higgs, Sarah Fitzgibbon, and Orla Kelly are collaborating with children from the First Friends Service and supported by dlr CYSPC and Barnardo's. Through meetings, creative active research, play sessions, devising, independent and group work, interdisciplinary opportunities that reflect and inspire the children's poetic curiosity and wonderings through music, puppetry and immersive space will take place. Ending in free creative experiences for the public on Cruinniú na Óg 2022.

The Big House in Irish Art – a talk with Mags Harnett

On 31 May, artist and art historian Mags Harnett, gave a talk on the different types of artworks that came from the Big House in Ireland. What message, if any, did paintings in



the Big House convey? What can artwork tell us about the lives of those who occupied the Big Houses? This talk, exploring artwork and the Big House in Ireland, formed part of the programme for *Shifting Foundations - The Big Houses of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown*, the <u>2021 Decade of Centenaries</u> project from dlr Heritage Office.

Exhibition Programme

Czech Heroines & Good 100

17 May - 30 June 2022 (LexIcon, Level 3)

This striking double exhibition, by renowned Czech illustrator, artist and writer, Mrs. Renáta Fučíková, was launched by His Excellency Mr. Petr Kynštetr, Ambassador of the Czech Republic to Ireland, on 17 May. The opening ceremony was also attended by An Cathaoirleach Cllr Lettie McCarthy.

Czech Heroines, an illustrated mosaic of stories of important Czech women - queens, politicians, artists, scientists, and athletes - was inspired by the 100th anniversary of the enactment of equal suffrage for Czechoslovak women in 1920.

Good 100 is a set of illustrations of selected important moments in the history of the Republic from the founding of Czechoslovakia in 1918 to the present. *Organized by the Czech Embassy in Dublin in co-operation with dlr LexIcon.*
