# Points to remember

- Grant applications from Sports Clubs should be submitted under Sports Development Grants, except in the case of applications for a Community Facilities Grant
- Community Grants awarded are based on a percentage of the cost, your organisation will be required to fund the 20% or 30% depending on grant and/or IAD
- IAD **I**dentified **A**rea of **D**isadvantage based on POBAL's HP Deprivation Index





- Universal Grants 2023: Closing date: 5p.m, Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> October 2022
- Groups can apply for more than one grant provided each application relates to a different activity, event or initiative and applied for in a separate application form
- Mobile Digital Devices may be considered for funding
- Garda vetting requirements & all policies & procedures in line with Children First: National Guidelines for the Protection and Welfare of Children

### Frequently Asked Questions

## When will the group receive funding:

- 1. You will receive your letter of notification in January 2023.
- 2. Once notified of approval you can purchase the items awarded in the grant any items purchased before the approval will not qualify.
- 3. Submit your receipts you can post your receipts or scan and email to community@dlrcoco.ie
- 4. Funds will be electronically transferred to your account once valid receipts are received (please note this may take up to 2 weeks).



### Frequently Asked Questions

### What are the main reasons for refusal:

- The groups does not demonstrate the ability to match fund the project.
- The group is not a constituted community / voluntary group.
- The expenditure items do not meet with grant criteria ie personal items, perishable items.
- The application is **incomplete**, too vague or contains **insufficient information**
- The group **applied for the same funding/project** under another
  grant application with a different
  department within DLR.

# **Environment**and Climate Action Grant

Supports Residents' Associations, Tidy District & Tidy Town Groups who work to enhance and improve their local public areas.

Funds up to **70% of project costs.** The maximum grant available in 2023 is **€800**.

#### **Eligible projects include:**

- a) purchase of plants or trees for public areas,
- b) purchase of estate name stones,
- c) hosting of local environmental talks, workshops or local environmental / climate action campaigns,
- d) purchase of minor non-mechanical equipment to assist with a planting project (e.g. a spade, trowel or gloves),
- e) a combination of the above.

What is heritage? - DLR Heritage includes

historic buildings, places and structures; archaeology; documents and genealogy; flora and fauna; wildlife habitats; landscapes and seascapes; wrecks; geology; stories and folklore

Who can apply? - groups and societies who have an idea for a heritage **event**, **publication or exhibition** (including digital)

How much? - the maximum grant for any single project is €5,000

 What is not covered - general operating expenses; advertising; hospitality; prize money; or to cover fundraising or the hire of Council premises.



Business Organisations and Business Representative Groups can apply for **Business Area Promotion Grants** 

Up to 75% funding is available for schemes that attract customers or promote business in an area

Type of activities that can be funded includes:

- Website content and update
- Business Awards
- Placemaking
