Foxrock, or in Irish, Carrig an tShionnaigh, is in the civil parish of Kill in the barony of Rathdown. It has been recorded in the place names records by Liam Price as 'Clonkeen now generally called Foxrock and this is quite a modern name'. The placenames record notes that it is also called Cnoch Shionnaigh or anglicised as Knockshinna. The old Gaelic area, which Foxrock is part of, was called **Clonkeen**. This was part of the wide, flat valley, with the ground rising gently towards the ridges of Rochestown Avenue on the east and Brennanstown, Brighton and Torquay Roads above the N11 on the west. The 'Clon' portion of the name Clonkeen tells us that the area was a fertile clearing, a meadow, surrounded by boggy ground, while the 'caoin' element points to a pleasant, gentle, and congenial ambience in the valley. To learn more about the area, join Myles Reid from the Foxrock Local History Club. The group held its first meeting in January 1981 and has been giving talks and having outings since. Over the past 44 years they have covered many local topics and general history of the country around us. More information on their website: foxrocklocalhistory.ie.

Although we mostly use sound to communicate, humans are highly visual animals. This workshop with Natasha Ariff, biodiversity and landscape consultant, is both an exploration of soundscape ecology - the study of the entire collection of sounds that are emitted from a landscape – and an invitation to the participants to become attuned to the natural world.

Using film and an audio presentation of bird song, participants are invited to 'turn on their ears' by actively listening. These sounds are explored using words and pictures, thereby providing the tools for the participants to create their own language to describe the magic of nature. Both the act of listening and writing will leave an imprint of the bird sounds on the participants' mind, which hopefully, they will remember the next time they hear them, having now been tuned into nature!

Guglielmo Marconi and the Waves of Made in Italy: A Journey through the Life and Discoveries of the Inventor of the Wireless Telegraph and the Radio

On the occasion of the 150th anniversary of the birth of the Italian-Irish scientist Guglielmo Marconi, we are celebrating his genius by recalling some of his extraordinary inventions. This exhibition, organised by the Embassy of Italy in Ireland and the Istituto Italiano di Cultura Dublin with the support of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council, is curated by the Ministry of Enterprise and Made in Italy of Rome and displays memorabilia objects that tell the story of Guglielmo Marconi's scientific experience, including showcasing transmitting and receiving devices, telegraphs and radios, historical photographs and videos. What's in a name? A Visual History Celebrating the Town's Name Change in 1920

As part of dlr Lexlcon's 10th Anniversary, we are showcasing this very popular exhibition which was first displayed in 2020. In 1821 the name Dunleary or Dun Leary was changed to Kingstown in honour of King George IV's visit to this bustling and rapidly developing town. In 1920, it was officially given the name Dún Laoghaire, referring to the original Irish name for Dunleary. In the years following the establishment of the Irish Free State, the use of Kingstown gradually diminished and was replaced in the consciousness of visitors and residents of the town by variants of the name – Dunleary, Dun Laoire and Dún Laoghaire.

dlr Libraries acquired nearly 700 postcards of the Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown area from the sale of the Seamus Kearns Collection of Postcards in 2019. These images form the basis of a publication entitled **What's in a Name? Dun Leary – Kingstown – Dún Laoghaire: A Visual History**, an accompanying exhibition featuring a selection of these postcards.


