





#### **Drainage and Flood Alleviation**

Engineering and Environmental Consultants were appointed in December 2019 for Flood Risk Management works on the Deansgrange Stream. This is a 4-to-5-year project. Activities completed to date include additional survey work, CCTV surveys, a Constraints Study, Hydrological analysis, and hydraulic modelling. Optioneering, environmental surveys and engagement with key stakeholders continue. A Ground Investigation Contract is complete. We have received preliminary approval from Irish Rail to tunnel under the rail line. Public Consultation on the preferred option took place on the 13<sup>th</sup> December. The environmental impacts review is almost completed. The Part 8 submission is proposed shortly.

Engineering and Environmental Consultants have also been appointed for Flood Risk Management Works on the Carrickmines/Shanganagh Rivers. This is a 5+ year project. Data gathering is underway. A Flow/Rainfall Survey is complete. Further topographical survey work has been done. Early damage/benefits assessments are underway to ensure a cost-beneficial scheme is achievable. An initial public engagement is complete following short briefing sessions with Area Councillors. The Hydrology/Hydraulic report is now complete. The on-site Site Investigation work is largely completed. The options for the project are being considered. Interim technical reports have been developed for some option locations due to the complexity.

The Monkstown environs flood risk mapping project is substantially completed, and final draft mapping and draft options have been submitted for review.

#### **Tourism Development**

#### Cruise Welcome, training, artwork & staff

The 1<sup>st</sup> four cruise ships arrived this month into Dun Laoghaire harbour. Upon arrival the guests are greeted with large scale welcome imagery of the area. On their way out of the harbour they then see visuals suggesting places to see in the county.

Staff training took place for the panel of welcome staff to welcome the guests over the summer. The staff were briefed on what guests can see, do and the wealth of events available to the guests throughout the year.

A new welcome kiosk was branded and placed in the harbour. The new kiosk was wrapped in dlr colours and shows icons of the local landmarks.

#### Piloting Walking Tours

With the arrival of the 1<sup>st</sup> cruise ships there is a pilot walking tour programme in place to guide guests around the town and into the bars/restaurants.

#### Zipit – Zip Trail Opening

On 24<sup>th</sup> April Zipit launched their new 30-minute additional zip lining course to their Tibradden facility. The investment of €200,000 by Cool Running Events was launched by Minister Catherine Martin and attended by representatives from dlr Tourism, Coillte & Failte Ireland.

#### **Quarterly Ezine**

Our 1<sup>st</sup> quarterly ezine went out at the start of the month with all the reopened activities this spring along with upcoming events.

#### Coastival 2023

DLR Tourism are collaborating on the development of a new summer festival in Dun Laoghaire called Coastival. Preparations & planning of events during the new Coastival Festival are ongoing.



#### New DLR Tourism Strategy 2023 – 2028

A baseline study & the consultation phase of the new tourism strategy are currently being prepared.

#### Winter in Dublin

Failte Ireland launched their plans for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of Winter in Dublin promoting Dublin as a destination in the shoulder seasons of Nov to Jan. The networking event took place at Guinness storehouse and was attending by dlr tourism and tourism providers in the county.

## Dún Laoghaire Harbour

#### **Cruise Ship Business**

The Cruise Ship Season has commenced with approximately 95 Cruise Ships booked in for 2023 at present with over 160,000 passengers and 68,000 crew. We are working with the Tourism Department, the Dun Laoghaire Business Association and the Dun Laoghaire Chamber of Commerce to maximise the local benefits of the cruise visitors.

#### Grant Funding

The Brexit Adjustment Local Authority Marine Infrastructure (BALAMI) Scheme 2022 – 2023 from the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine has launched a Second Tranche call for applications. Dún Laoghaire Harbour received over  $\in$ 3 million in grant funding from the first tranche. We submitted 5 grant applications to this scheme by the deadline of 30<sup>th</sup> September 2022 and have been awarded another  $\in$ 1 million in grant funding for improvements on the Carlisle Pier.

#### Projects:

#### **National Watersports Campus**

DLRCC in partnership with Irish Sailing and the Irish Underwater Council have been approved in principle for Stream 1 Grant funding for the development of a National Watersports Campus. We have responded to requests for additional information and are now finalising the grant process and agreements with the project partners. An MOU has been signed with Irish Sailing and Diving Ireland in order to set out and agree the objectives of the project.

A concept brochure was presented to the Elected Members during the February 2023 Council meeting and has since been published. It is hoped that this initiative will assist in building momentum and support for the project.

#### Berth 2 Fenders (Carlisle Pier)

A project to replace the Berth 2 Fenders has been given approval to proceed to procurement stage. RPS Group have been appointed to carry out the design and procurement for this project. This project was tendered, and Sorensen Construction have been appointed to deliver the project. We are awaiting Foreshore Consent to proceed to works on site.



Grant funding has recently been secured for the installation phase of this project from the recent Brexit Local Authority Marine Infrastructure Scheme.

#### Berth 3 Fenders (Carlisle Pier)

Grant funding has recently been secured for a project to replace the Berth 3 Fenders from the recent Brexit Local Authority Marine Infrastructure Scheme. The project has been given approval to proceed to procurement stage. RPS Group have been appointed to carry out the design and procurement for this project as it is a mirror image of the Berth 2 Fender project.

#### **Carlisle Pier Deck repairs and lighting**

Grant funding has recently been secured for a project to resurface the deck of the Carlisle Pier and install lighting towers from the recent Brexit Local Authority Marine Infrastructure Scheme. The contactor is now on site and works are progressing well. This project should be completed by late May 2023.

#### **East Pier Revetment Repairs**

Grant funding has recently been secured for a project to repair the sloping revetment at the back (east side) of the East Pier from the recent Brexit Local Authority Marine Infrastructure Scheme. This revertant provides the primary protection for the East Pier and has suffered some damage over recent years from the larger storms. Punch Consulting Engineers have been appointed to design and manage the project which is likely to be on site during the summer of 2023. Cunningham Civil & Marine have been appointed to carry out the works on this project and it is due to commence on site in June/July this year.

#### Ferry Terminal

Retrofit works have commenced in the front office portion of the ferry terminal building, and this section is nearing completion. The tenant hopes to have the first sub-tenants on site in Q2 2023.

#### **Dublin Array Windfarm**

The developers of the Dublin Array Windfarm have approached the Harbour about the possibility of establishing an Operations and Maintenance Base for the windfarm. It is hoped that there might be synergies with the Ferry Terminal project. Early engagement is ongoing with the developer's team to establish the exact requirements.

#### **Coastival Festival 2023**

The Biennial Dun Laoghaire Regatta is due to take place in July 2023. We are working with several DLRCC departments to expand this into a week-long festival named "Coastival" for the Dun Laoghaire Town and Harbour areas. This is planned to run from  $1^{st} - 9^{th}$  July and many DLRCC departments are involved in putting together a schedule of events.

## **Municipal Services**

The Ballyogan Regional Temporary Rest Centre opened its doors to Ukrainian nationals on 28 April. The Rest Centre continues to accommodate up to 300 displaced Ukrainian nationals for short periods. Over 3,000 people have stayed at the Centre for short periods.

As part of a comprehensive wrap around service, accommodation services at the Centre are being supported by HSE staff including Environmental Health, Public Health and COVID-19 services. The HSE is providing onsite support to meet the healthcare needs of Ukrainian residents, and residents also have access to an offsite GP service 7 days a week.

Among the facilities available in the temporary rest Centre is separate laundry and sanitary facilities, internet access, television spaces, games consoles, games room, chessboards, use of bikes and scooters, libraries of Ukrainian books for children and adults, translation services, as well as online access to Ukrainian newspapers and magazines.

Additionally, orientation and information sessions, basic English language lessons and an arts and music entertainment programme is being developed both onsite and nearby offsite.



Local coordination efforts continue to provide comprehensive support services from Southside Partnership, HSE, An Garda Siochána, Department of Social Protection, dlr Education and Training Board, TUSLA, Community and Family Resource Centres, dlr Volunteers Centre, colleagues in the East Region and a number of other community and voluntary groups.

Work is now underway to provide extra facilities, including 92 extra beds, a homework club room for children, an adult's workspace, and a new improved space for teenagers.

#### Cleansing, Beaches & Coastal Protection Updates – April 2023

- Quinn's Road Beach Access Repair Project Main Contractor is expected to start on site on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of May, the project will run for approximately 8 weeks and access to the beach will be prohibited during this timeline.
- 40 Foot Remedial Repairs The final ladder and handrail element have been installed.
- Kavanagh's Corner (adjacent to the 40 Foot) Storm damage occurred to the bathing area on the 9<sup>th</sup> March. Site surveys are now complete. Drawings are being prepared for tender purposes.
- Killiney Beach Replacement of protective fencing works have commenced beneath an area prone to cliff face coastal erosion.
- Marker Buoys A proposal has been sent to the Board of Irish Lights for the installation of 2 Marker Buoys at the 40 Foot waterfront and 3 Marker Buoys at the DLR Baths waterfront. Approval to install the Marker Buoys is pending from Irish Lights.
- Public Realm cleaning is on-going presently with power washing and furniture cleaning.
- DLR Baths Maintenance crews are in place at the Baths and daily cleaning is underway to remove washed up seaweed, stones, sand etc. whilst also emptying bins.
- The Road and Cycle Lane Sweeping is on-going as per the schedules and also as per CRM requests.



- Gully Cleaning operations and early morning works are on-going.
- Beach Lifeguard interviews were held. A second Beach Lifeguard advert has been released with a closing date of the 4<sup>th</sup> May.
- Bathing Water Sampling is on-going at our 9 locations every fortnight as scheduled.
- Submissions for a contractor weeding tender are under review with the intention to appoint a contractor to start weeding by mid-May.
- The annual Bin Review is complete and has been circulated. The Bin review will be presented as a headed item at the upcoming Area Committees.

The Community response to the crisis in Ukraine and the influx of Ukrainian nationals into the county is being led and coordinated by Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council in collaboration with a wide range of stakeholders in the Community Response Forum, supported by a wide range of community and volunteer groups.

The Community Response Forum has been meeting since 28 March 2022 and has met once during April 2023. Support services are being provided to those Ukrainian nationals who are being accommodated in the Ballyogan Rest Centre and Larch Hill Scout Centre as well as in hotels and in private accommodation within the County.

English classes and other activities continue to be provided in Ballyogan, Sandyford, Dundrum and Loughlinstown. English classes are also being provided in libraries. Employment support services are being organised by Southside Partnership dlr.

#### Joint Policing Committee (JPC) & Local Policing Fora (LPF)

The JPC Annual Report 2022 was noted at the April Council meeting.

Pádraig's performance included songs and the stories behind them accompanied by a visual presentation, from the 18th to 20th century of serial murderers, executions, hauntings and grave robbing.

#### Library Clubs & Groups for adults

A wide variety of clubs and groups continue to use our library spaces to meet.

These include the Language Exchanges and the Scrabble Club in Deansgrange Library, the Craft Circle in Shankill Library, the Knit Club in Cabinteely Library, and the Family Lego Club in Blackrock Library. The staff-led Film Club in Blackrock continues along with the Ciorcal Comhrá, the informal Irish conversation group which takes place in the LexIcon Café every Tuesday morning.

Each of the 8 branches have in-person book clubs, including the Audio Book Club in Dundrum Library with some also continuing with their online book clubs, due to ongoing demand. The very popular online monthly Book Club with Mary Burnham continues to meet online. Midwinter Break by Bernard Mc Laverty, was discussed at the April meeting.

As part of its centenary year celebrations, the Ulysses book Club for adults is ongoing in Dundrum Library. For those who've always wanted to read this literary masterpiece, members have been meeting monthly to discuss two chapters at a time in order to finish the tome ahead of Bloomsday on 16 June 2023.

#### **Exhibition Programme**

#### Captured: An exhibition by the Dublin Camera Club Level 4, dlr LexIcon Until 11 April 2023

The Dublin Camera Club, founded in 1945, is the oldest and largest camera club in Ireland. It brings together photographers of all ages and abilities to develop and share knowledge in a collaborative environment. This wonderful exhibition is the first time since the Pandemic that the club is holding an exhibition of photographic prints.

#### What Lies Beneath: Excavating the former Europa Cars site in Blackrock Level 3, dlr LexIcon Until 24 April 2023

This archaeological exhibition gives an insight into what was found on the site of the former Europa Cars Ltd, located on the corner of Newtown Avenue and Maretimo Terrace in Blackrock. The excavation was carried out under archaeological licence by Aisling Collins Archaeology Services (ACAS) over a four month period commencing in January 2022.

The dig revealed the foundations of Dove House which dates from as early as the 1700s. Most of the artefacts recovered date from the 18th and 19th centuries and provide an interesting portal into the daily lives of the residents of this house. The other major



development revealed on the site were the two tram depots which were constructed at the turn of the 19th century.

#### Theatre through the years: A collection of theatrical memorabilia from dlr Local Studies Collection Level 5, dlr LexIcon Until 30 April 2023

This exhibition is a curated display of books and memorabilia relating to the theatre of Dublin and the local area of DLR. It is a selection from amateur and professional drama groups and theatres. The exhibits on display show the talent and variety of the theatre and its thespians.

#### Press Photographer of the Year 2023 Exhibition Level 4, dlr LexIcon 11 April- 11 May 2023

The Press Photographers' Association of Ireland (PPAI) exhibition is now on display in dlr LexIcon, Dún Laoghaire. The exhibition of winning and highly-commended imagery was officially launched by An Cathaoirleach, Cllr. Mary Hanafin on 13 April and will be on display until 11 May. The Press Photographer of the Year 2023 title was awarded to Mark Condren of Irish Independent/Sunday Independent for a record sixth time. The judges commented: "The photographer did not just manage to cover the main events of the year, at home and abroad, but they brought to their assignments an unerring ability to come away with remarkable images. Their sense of news value, sense of timing, ability to choose original angles and creativity all came to the fore and they are an absolutely deserving winner of this award."
