DLR Tourism programme

1. Accessible Tourism Programme:

A: Tailored Accessibility Training programme

On January 17th a one day training programme on Accessible Tourism was delivered to 20 staff members from various departments in DLRCC. This training programme was delivered by Universal Access & European Network for Accessible Tourism (ENAT).

B: Conduct a pilot Accessibility Audit

As part of the Accessible Tourism programme we engaged the European Network for Accessible Tourism (ENAT) to conduct a pilot study of the main tourism access routes in Dun Laoghaire. This audit was conducted over three days in January and was very detailed. A draft audit report has been produced.

C: Accessible Tourism Conference

April 26th DLRCC hosted a conference entitled "Destinations for All" as part of our Accessible Tourism programme. The conference was opened by An Cathaoirleach, Tom Murphy and attended by over 70 people from a wide range of organisations around Ireland. The general feedback for attendees at this conference was very positive.

2. Tourism Maps

As part of implementing out Tourism Strategy, two of the three trail maps promoting our signature experiences have been developed. The *Urban Splash Trail Map* promoting the coast and its towns and villages has been completed and is now available. The *Well Worth The Climb Trail Map* has also been completed. This map promotes the rural parts of the County and the viewing points over the county & city. These maps will now be disseminated through the county and city to encourage visitors to experience Dun Laoghaire-Rathdown.

3. Dublin "Breath of Fresh Air" - Update on New Brand Tagline.

DIr alongside the other 3 Dublin Local Authorities is working in partnership with Failte Ireland and other stakeholders on a 10 year vision for Tourism in the Dublin Region. The aim is to maximise the sustainable economic and social contribution from tourism to Dublin City and County. Part of the work has included looking at the marketing of the destination and performance of the Brand – Brand Name, Brand Proposition, Brand Logo and Brand Tagline. The following is the update from Failte Ireland on the research and performance review of the current Brand "Dublin "A Breath of Fresh Air" and the new tagline Dublin "Surprising by Nature".

Fáilte Ireland launched a new tourism brand and accompanying tagline for Dublin in 2015, 'Dublin. A Breath of Fresh Air'. As is best practice, the brands performance was continuously monitored and as part of this process, Fáilte Ireland in 2017 undertook a series of research studies to evaluate the strength of the brand and ascertain how it is perceived by a broad range of stakeholders including international and domestic visitors, Dubliners, trade and business tourism interests.

Following this comprehensive research and validation process, the current brand will be boosted by a stronger and more vibrant colour palette and a new tagline, 'Surprising by Nature' has been developed for use.

Both tweaks to the existing brand will now be rolled out from July 2018.

4. Regional Festival and Participative Event Grants.

For a number of years Failte Ireland administered an annual Regional Festivals and Participative Events Grant Scheme. For the first time in 2018 Failte Ireland gave this grant mechanism over to Local Authorities to administer. In total €12, 000 was made available to DLRCC under this scheme for 2018.

DLRCC advertised this scheme in February and received 12 applications. 7 applications were successful in securing funding. 5 applications were unsuccessful as they did not meet the assessment criteria.

- Stillorgan Village Area Movement Framework Plan Phase 2.
 Atkins appointed as design consultant for phase 2 of the scheme which is on Kilmacud Rd Lower from the Scouts Den to KBC bank.
- Landscape Road Traffic Scheme, Churchtown Phase 1.SIAC awarded contract and works commenced in early April. Works are substantially complete.
- Landscape Road Traffic Scheme, Churchtown Phase 2.
 Richard Nolan Civil Engineers awarded contract for phase 2.
- Installation of the 7th Variable Message Signage on the Rock Road is complete.

- Stillorgan Road Greenfield Road Bus stop A consultant has been appointed for the design of a Bus stop on Stillorgan Road at the end of Greenfield Road and topographical surveys are underway
- Sandyford Cycle Route (UCD Accessibility on Clonskeagh Road) A Road Safety Audit has been carried out on the preliminary design and detailed design has commenced.
- Pedestrian and Cycle Scheme on N11 from The Rise to UCD at Nova Building Preliminary design has been completed for the design of a new pedestrian and cycle entrance on Stillorgan Road at UCD, the upgrade of the Fosters Avenue junction and the development of a two way cycle route link. The scheme has been presented to both the Dún Laoghaire and Dundrum Area Committees and public consultation process has commenced.
- Sandyford Cycle Route (Kilgobbin Road/ Drummartin Link Road): Following approval of the preliminary design from the NTA/TII public consultation process has commenced on the scheme.
- Stillorgan Road Brewery Road Junction Safety Improvement scheme a Safety Audit has been carried out on the design and a tender has been issued to appoint a consultant for the scheme detailed design.
- Cruagh Wood, Stepaside to Ballyogan Road Greenway Link Tenders Documents has been completed.
- Upper Churchtown Road/ Taney Road /Dundrum Road junction -Assessment and Options Report completed and sent to the NTA.
- Frankfort Park/Dundrum Road Upgraded the pedestrian crossing at the junction of Frankfort Park with Dundrum Road to reduce the speed of vehicles entering and exiting Frankfort Park. The build-out of the kerb lines at the junction reduced the width of this crossing for pedestrians and vulnerable road users while improving access and egress to and Frankfort Park. Scheme has been completed.
- 30kph Speed Alert Signage Pilot Scheme in Residential Estates- Phase 2: Ongoing at 2nd locations.
- Brehon Field road- New Pedestrian Crossing nearing Completion at Granitefield Estate Junction. Awaiting power supply connection.
- Charlemont Avenue the conversion of Charlemont Avenue to a one way system has been through public consultation and was presented to the Dun Laoghaire Area Committee at the March meeting. The Traffic Section intends to proceed with the scheme to convert the road to a one way system in the coming weeks

Drainage, Flood Alleviation and Coastal Works

- Kilbogget Park Flood Storage: Design and ground investigation is complete. Part 8 documentation complete. The proposal was noted at the January Dun Laoghaire Area Committee. It is now proposed to proceed with the Part 8 Consultation process.
- Glenavon Park Flood Storage/Wetlands Feasibility: The Feasibility Study has been completed and has recommended further detailed flow measurement surveys and analysis. This additional survey/analysis work is now completed. Final report received. Liaison ongoing with the OPW.
- Cabinteely Park Flood Storage Works: Hydraulic modelling work underway. Feasibility report complete. Concept/preliminary design has commenced earlier than planned. Ongoing liaison with Parks over embankment design.
- Fernhill Park Flood Storage: Hydraulic modelling work commenced in March 2017. Feasibility report complete. Parks are progressing preliminary design.
- Sandyford Park Flood Storage: Hydraulic modelling work delayed in order to expedite the Bracken Road hydraulic modelling. Feasibility report now complete. Project on hold pending direction from the OPW.
- Priorsland Flood Alleviation Update Report: Report complete. Ongoing liaison and provision of Technical Input to Cherrywood Planning Scheme Development Agency.
- Old Dublin Road Culvert. All drainage works are now complete. Only outstanding item is the re-instatement of the anti-skid.
- Dundrum Slang Integrated Catchment Model: Tenders being evaluated.
- Carysfort Maretimo Integrated Catchment Model (Phase I) Brief preparation is complete.

Draft Flood Risk management Plans (FRMPs)

When the plans are finalised they will then be sent to the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform for approval. If approved, they will then be sent to the Local Authorities who may adopt them. 7. Community Development & Social Inclusion Events & Activities

Universal Grant Scheme (Community Grants)

The Community Development Team held 10 information sessions during March and April where they provided advice and guidance on the Grants Scheme with a view to improving the quality of applications and help groups to maximise their chances of securing funding. There was once again a high volume of applications, 168 applications were received for Community Grants by 20th April. These are currently being logged and will be assessed in the coming weeks.

Children and Young Person's Consultation

Comhairle na Nog representatives were among 60 young people who attended and participated in a Children and Young Persons Services Youth Consultation event on 17th April in Crosscare Youth Services in the Boylan Centre, Dun Laoghaire. The workshop was organised by the Dun Laoghaire Rathdown Children and Young People's Services Committee (DLR CYPSC). It was a lively event with broad representation from a range of youth leadership organisations, youth groups and services. The aim of the workshop was to bring young people from across the County together to take part in a consultation workshop to hear their voices and views on what they think could improve the health, education, safety and wellbeing of young people in Dun Laoghaire Rathdown. The feedback from this workshop will help inform a three year dlr CYPSC Plan which is expected to be finalised by the end of 2018.

Age Friendly Programme

A Community and Safety Workshop, which was organised by the Garda Older Persons' Association (GOPA) with support from the Gardaí, HSE and the Council, was held in Ballinteer St. John's GAA Club on 12th April 2018, with approximately 120 older people in attendance. This Workshop which covers security, physical activity/health and safeguarding will be hosted in Loughlinstown and Stillorgan in Q3 and Q4 2018.

The Age Friendly "Touchstone Course" which was funded by dlr and delivered in partnership with UCD concluded on 11th April 2018. This Programme was aimed at people aged over 55 from dlr, who are interested in community development and wanted to acquire the skills and knowledge to support them in helping to make their communities more age friendly. Following the completion of the course, working groups have been established by the participants to explore issues of importance to older people in the County.

The Age Friendly Recognition and Achievement Awards were held in Monaghan on 11th April 2018. Both Dublin Bus and the Dance Theatre of Ireland were shortlisted and commended for their work to improve the lives of older people in the County.

Double Vision exhibition finished on Sunday 25 March; 8,300 people visited the exhibition over the course of the run.

And the Women Voted –exhibition opened on Saturday 7 April and includes work by women artists from the substantial AIB Art Collection. The works have been specially selected for the Municipal Gallery by a group of women from the Women4Women Network who worked with artist/ curator Claire Halpin. Women4Women is a non-profit networking group for women with different life experiences and from different cultures living in Dún Laoghaire Rathdown County. As part of the learning programme, the network hosted their International Women's Breakfast in the Studio on April 25 and over 94 women attended. Dún Laoghaire Harbour Company

A special meeting of the County Council was held on Tuesday 6th March 2018 to discuss the draft report of the Risk Review on Dún Laoghaire Harbour Company. A number of resolutions were passed and were forwarded to the Department of Transport Tourism and Sport and the Department of Housing Planning and Local Government.

A letter has been received from the Minister of Transport, Tourism and Sport stating that he has made the decision to transfer the harbor in line the with Council's view i.e. Option B. The letter also stated that the business associated with the port has now fallen well below a level that would justify the continuance of a separate legal entity. It is further stated that the National Ports Policy clearly states there is no exchequer funding for any port. The Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport must obtain the consent of the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform and the Minister for Housing Planning and Local Government regarding the decision to be taken in respect of the future governance of Dún Laoghaire Harbour.

Discussions are still on-going with the Council's parent department regarding the funds required to deal with the infrastructure issue and the Council proposes to re-engage with the engineering consultants to establish the implications of some or any of the works not proceeding.

The Risk Report was presented to the Council's statutory Audit and Risk Committee and was noted them on 19th April 2018 as being a "material risk" to the Council unless funds are forthcoming.

No provision has been made to date regarding the costs identified in the Risk Report of bringing all of the infrastructure to "Taking in Charge" standard and the Annual Maintenance required to preserve "Taking in Charge" standard.

The order for the transfer and dissolution of the Harbour Company has not been completed and can only proceed with the agreement of all three Ministers.

Applications received in April fell under the following categories:




