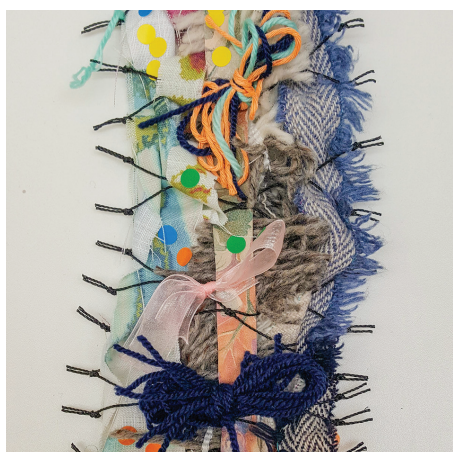

Participants will be supported and encouraged to respond to the Utopia/Dystopia exhibition using drawing and paint with Artist Rachel Burke. All materials will be supplied.

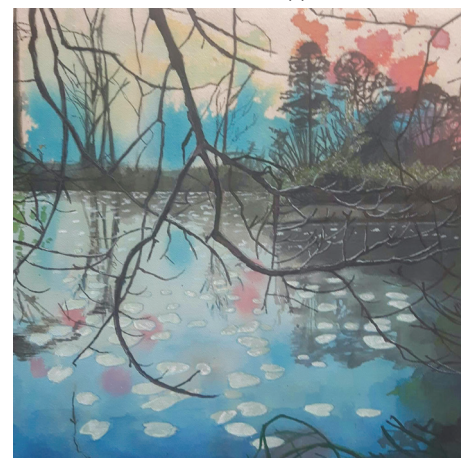
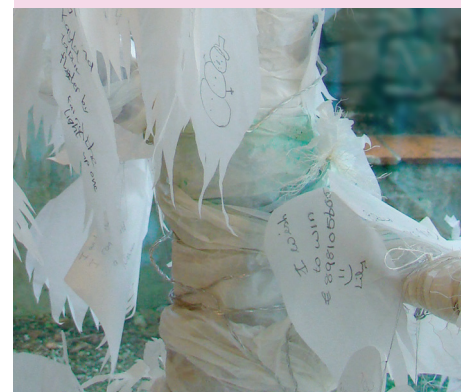


IMAGE: *Altamont*, by Rachel Burke.
